Peachey and Wesser Attend Outback Challenge

Rugby League's One Community Ambassador David Peachey travelled to Bourke through the week as he continued his 11-day mission to inspire hundreds of Indigenous boys and girls in regional NSW and WA towns to follow their dreams. Peachey and fellow One Community Ambassador Rhys Wesser visited more than 200 Years 3 to 6 students from areas such as Gilgandra and Goodooga as part of the annual Outback Challenge in Bourke, in remote north-west NSW on Thursday 3rd May.

Fifteen boys teams and five girls teams will take part in the all-day round robin tournament, which brings together students from outback schools, including those doing home schooling, as part of Rugby League's ongoing commitment to Indigenous Australia. The local St Ignatius girls team will defend their title, while the boys competition will have a new winner, with the defending premiers Dubbo South not attending this year.

Peachey was also at the Point Wolstoncroft Sport and Recreation Centre at Gwandalan on the NSW Central Coast to work with 60 Aboriginal students from the broader Hunter region as part of a program to boost their climb towards academic excellence and a successful career pathway.

On Saturday, he will join with One Community Ambassadors Trent Barrett and Mario Fenech on an eight-day visit to the Pilbara Region as part of Rugby League's commitment to the development of the game in regional WA. They will visit Karratha, Port Hedland and Wickham, with an emphasis on junior development in schools and clubs.

As well as conducting coaching and skills clinics in these areas over the next 11 days, Peachey and the other Ambassadors will showcase Rugby League's unique education, health and wellbeing One Community programs such as Eat Well, Play Well, Stay Well; Dream, Believe, Achieve; and Rugby League Reads.
