## SENIOR COACHES REPORT 2005

A real feeling of excitement and higher expectation surrounded the coaching staff at the beginning of our 2005 campaign. Unlike 2004 which began with much uncertainty and some heavy player losses, 2005 pre-season began in terrific fashion. Matthew Verfurth was our first new appointment as Reserves coach, followed quickly by Tim Sherman returning to the club as playing Assistant coach. These appointments together with Mark Hovey returning as chairman of selectors ensured a strong off field position and could allow us to concentrate on recruiting.

The most pleasing thing about our recruiting campaign was not only the huge signings of Sherman, Wells, Rau, Butler and later Richards and Head, it was also our player retention. Only 1 departure (Simon Dandy) in our top 25 players from last years senior best and fairest was a result that not too many other clubs could boast. Add young guns Reece Woods, Jason Kerby and Justin Bosely from our under 18's and momentum at South Barwon in twelve months had well and truly swung.

It was time now to put our pre-season efforts to practice and the year could not have got off to a better start. We looked unstoppable, 9 and 0 at the half way mark of the Home and Away before narrow losses to Newtown and North Shore meant we were 9 and 2 after playing every side once.

Whilst this was happening our clubrooms were undertaking a renovation meaning all games were played away and we would finish with the Majority of our games home at McDonald Reserve. At this stage we were on top of the ladder and extremely confident of keeping this position.

However the next seven games were average and by seasons end we finished 14 and 4 in second position just being edged out by North Shore.

It was clear that against mediocre opposition we were superb and really punished the opposition, but a question mark remained over us in the close ones. We had lost four games by under 18 points and our lowest winning margin was 24 points against St Josephs way back in round 2.

It was time for the final series and oh what a series it was! Firstly an extremely hard fought victory against St Josephs in what was perhaps the highest standard GFL football game I have seen, followed by the shellacking of a disappointing North Shore after they had won 11 straight games. This set us up for a Grand Final Showdown against up and comers Newtown.

This day highlighted for me the guts, determination and belief this group has as we withstood Newtown's challenges time and time again. Post game celebrations were indicative of the tight club that we have become and thanks must go out to many people.

The coaches worked hard to create a strong bond amongst the players and they were successful in quickly establishing a very positive feeling amongst the playing group and support staff. A strong emphasis was placed on taking on a positive approach to training, preparation for matches and game day itself. The players learned a lot during the year about not only football but also their personalities and the importance of respecting your mates.

A leadership group of five top age players was an innovation of Meggsy's which showed benefits, particularly as the injury toll mounted. Benn Dodds was appointed as Captain, with the Vice-captains being Jason Kerby, Corey Bromley, Andrew McGarrigle and Reece Woods who went on to play his football with both the seniors and the Geelong Falcons. Congratulations to Reece for showing fantastic poise and huge promise in his first year as a senior player for the club. Jason Kerby also played senior football for the club showing his usual grit and determination, often against much bigger opponents. Congratulations Jason!

The season started promisingly with a narrow loss to last year's Premiers Bell Park but the serious shoulder injury to new recruit Jarrod McNally proved to be a sign of things to come with injuries sustained by key players throughout the year which undoubtedly had an impact on the fortunes of the team. Our first win came at Leopold in a very tight finish and we went on to win five games for the season. Several of our losses were narrow and for the greater part of the year we were competitive against our opposition, regardless of their position on the ladder.

Many players stood up when things were tough but probably none more so than Todd Mestrovic, the eventual Best and Fairest winner. Todd's value to the team was underlined when the Under 18 players voted on their most valuable player to the team where he polled the most votes from his peers. Congratulations to Todd on his well-deserved Best and Fairest win with 105 votes, Jason Kerby on finishing Runner-up with 80 votes and Ashley Dolley for his very consistent season which saw him finish third with 74 votes.

## **Netball Report 2005**

South Barwon netballers capped off a successful year for the club when they won premierships in five of the seven divisions. Our A Grade, B Grade, 17 and under, 15 and under, and 13 and under teams dominated GFL netball. For the second year in a row the A Grade team brought home the flag by beating Grovedale 61 - 44. B grade also defeated Grovedale with a score of 41 - 38.
