#### SOUTH PACIFIC COMPARED TO JAPAN

As a member of the Association of Track and Field Statisticians I am frequently sent Annual Ranking Lists from various countries. Recently arrived is the 1993 Japanese Annual.

It is an interesting exercise to compare our athletes with those of other countries and regions.

Using the South Pacific Ranking Lists for 1993 as prepared by Tony Isaacs, I have compiled a list of the top Pacific athletes ranked according to the position they would have on the Japanese 1993 Ranking Lists.

Only those athletes good enough to be ranked in the Japanese Top 50 will be included on the list.

This information is contained on a separate sheet.

Congratulations go to the Oceania athletes who won medals - they are in bold print on the Commonwealth Games medal list.

The overall competition was very exciting, and in some events genuinely of world standard, but despite the hype and uncritical commentary on TV, there were major disappointments.

For me (and many others) the major disappointment was the standard of the Kenyan Team. Because of the tension that has surfaced in recent years between the "overseas Kenyans" and the Kenyan Association, the selection process resulted in many of the in-form stars being omitted from the team. True, it gave a chance to many up-and coming athletes, but the overall status of the Games was diminished as a result.

The less experienced Kenyan team did win many medals, but the quality of the competition would have been much higher had the stars been selected.

One example of how many top Kenyan competitors were left out of the team - the winner of the Steeplechase, Johnstone Kipkoech was ranked only 11th in Kenya going into the Games.

I was personally disappointed at not seeing Benson Koech run in the 800m. We swapped track suits at the World Juniors in 1992 and I feel that I have a stake in his career. He leads the World List this year with a clocking of 1:43.17 at Rieti on 28th August.

Congratulations go to the big winners of the 1994 Mobil Grand Prix Competition - Nouredine Morceli (ALG) and Jackie Joyner-Kersey (USA). They won their respective events - 1500m and Long Jump scoring more points or having superior performances than their rivals in other events.

In all \$2.3m was distributed in prize money.

Nouredine Morceli was well clear in the Men's Division as he had a six point bonus for a W.R. The first 3 in the Women's Division were all on 72 points and had to be separated by the IAAF/Hungarian scoring Tables.

In the individual GP events prizes were for the top 8 with the money going from \$30 000 for 1st to K5 000 for 8th.

Thus Morceli and JJK each won \$130 000.

The outstanding Oceania performer was Cathy Freeman who came second in the 400m Final in the time of 50.04 - a new N.R.

#### I.A.A.F. WORLD CUP - LONDON

Peter Pulu (PNG) and Mary Estelle Kapalu (VAN) were chosen to be part of the Oceania Team. Peter eventually did not travel to London with the team but Mary Kapalu did. This makes her the first

South Pacific Woman to be part of an Oceania Team to a World Cup.

Mary was very unlucky not to be given an opportunity to compete. Her times in the 400mH were superior to the athlete who eventually competed for the Oceania Team.

In any event congratulations to the two athletes selected. It is an honour that has been previously bestowed only on Takale Tuna and Subul Babo.

# PHILADELPHIA DISTANCE RUN

**W**ILLIAM KOECH may have been a past winner of the World Half-Marathon Champs, but his recent tour of the US roads revealed a man less fit than in the past.

Running poorly at the George Sheehan Memorial 10km and Falmouth Road Race, Koech finally began to regain some of his past form at the Cobb 10km Classic in early September.

But in Philly the Kenyan, who in 1992 finished seventh in the Olympic 10,000m final, surprised with a late-race win over Matthews Motshwarateu.

After 4:46 and 4:42 opening miles, Koech broke from the field, only Motshwarateu following. Into headwinds between three and four miles out along the Schuylkill River, it became apparent that Koech was in control of the race. Several times with a wave of his hand he invited the South African, nicknamed Lop-en Val (run and fall) because of his wobbly style, to join him, but Motshwarateu continued to shadow him past 10km (29:16) and 10M (47:26). Finally at 11M, the Kenyan again signed Motshwarateu to run with him. "I wanted him to run side by side with me," relates Koech, "but I saw he was not coming up to join me so I just went away." Passing 20km in 58:57, Koech proceeded to a 62:04 clocking and the win, while Motshwarateu rolled across 23 seconds later. "I wanted to wait until 12 miles but my tactics didn't work," says the South African runner up who improved from 13th the previous year, "but my tactics didn't go right. I made a mistake in letting him go at 11M. Then I just gave up.

Anne Marie Letko, preparing for a second assault of the New York

City Marathon, took a more conservative approach. Initially she led early leader Nadia Prasad proceed unchallenged. Letko watched as ahead Delillah Asiago overhauled the Frenchwoman at about 3M and proceeded to pass 5M in 25:52 to Prasad's 26:19. With 140 miles in that week, Letko wanted to use her strength, slowly reeling in the early leaders. After passing Prasad, by 9M she had drawn within 6sec of Asiago, and at 10M Letko drew up alongside. "We ran together until 12M and I left her at the top of the hill there," the Peachtree Road race winner explains.

Having zipped by the Art Museum steps of the film 'Rocky' fame, Letko continued unchallenged to a 15 sec victory and 70:03 clocking. Asiago crossed in 70:18 while Prasad, in the intermediate stages of a Tokyo Women's Marathon buildup, claimed 3rd in 70:59.

"I felt I was really moving, but she (Letko) came up to me," explains Asiago, who will soon return to Kenya after a long racing season. "You would relax when someone comes up to you but I tried to push. It was a mistake. She was strong at the end."
