## Origin of these Directions

## Key Message: These are the Referee Uniform DIRECTIONS of the EDJBA

- VBRA Uniform Policy
- EDJBA Referees Sub-committee 2013
- EDJBA Committee of Management 2013
- These are EDJBA DIRECTIONS:
- There is no right to the "I Have A Different Philosophy" approach


## Why have Directions

- To ensure consistency across the EDJBA
- To ensure consistency with VBRA Policy
- It's very hard to gain respect and expect respect when wildly out of uniform
- Does the EDJBA have the authority to issue these directives:
- Of course it does, as long as it does not contravene VBRA/BV policy
- Where the policy is silent, EDJBA may make its own directives
- Part of a referee's payment is designed to ensuring that they are in proper uniform
- These Directives conform to VBRA/BV policy


## Standard Uniform

## Key Message: EDJBA adopts and requires standard VBRA uniform

- Black \& White short-sleeve shirt
- Other styles or colours of top are not permitted without EDJBA \& VBRA permission
- Sponsorship logos etc are not permitted without EDJBA \& VBRA permission
- VBRA Badge (no other badges, and especially no club badges)
- Long Black pants (see summer uniform for exception)
- No stripes, club logos, advertising etc
- Black socks
- Black belt
- Black shoes for 1A (A Grade) officials and above. Other levels may wear white shoes
- No jewellery including no ear-rings, except for a flat wedding band and possibly a wrist-watch where there is no stadium clock


## White/Green/Black \& White Shirts

## Key Message: White shirts for Trainees/Apprentices Green shirts for newly-qualified 1C referees Black \& White for experienced referees

- White T-shirts for unqualified trainees/apprentices
- Treat as "L" plates
- Must be mainly white
- No club logos
- May have some minor graphics (non-offensive)
- Green Shirts - fully-qualified newer referees
- Treat as "P" Plates
- Treated and paid as 1C referees
- Can referee any games including finals
- But: treat with care and judgement on appointments
- Expect and require to be protected from all abuse
- Might not put all adults into Green shirts - individual Advisor's decision
- Black \& White shirts
- More experienced referees
- Accredited 1C and up


## Summer/Winter Uniform

## Key Message: Shorts and white shoes may be worn in Summer only

- Summer uniform is "Standard Uniform" plus:
- Optional shorts and optional white shoes/socks
- Proper plain sports shorts: No stripes, club logos, advertising etc
- Applies during daylight-savings period
- Not permitted during winter, and absolutely not during any finals
- Winter Uniform "Standard Uniform" plus:
- Branch jacket or BA Black Jacket in winter
- No other tops are permitted - it's the official branch jacket if any, or the plain BA black jacket, or just the Black \& White short-sleeve shirt
- Special note: jackets from other leagues and club jackets are particularly not permitted
- In particular, nothing with advertising on it unless approved by EDJBA and VBRA


## Finals Uniform

## Key Message: Long pants must be worn for ALL finals

- Standard Uniform Plus:
- Long Black Pants for all finals games (summer and winter) at all venues (no exceptions)


## Special Directions

## Key Message: Referees MUST NOT have any part of their uniform visible while not officiating

- Referees, Referee-Coaches and Referee-supervisors will not:
- Wear any observable refereeing-type uniform while:
- Coaching Teams
- Spectating
- Administrating
- Team managing or otherwise acting any non-officiating capacity
- The idea is to avoid any perception of intimidation or collusion between referees as coaches/players/spectators and referees on court.
- Referees, referee-coaches, supervisors and administrators AT ANY VENUE have the EDJBA authority to direct non-active referees to coverup or remove officiating uniforms while not officiating.
