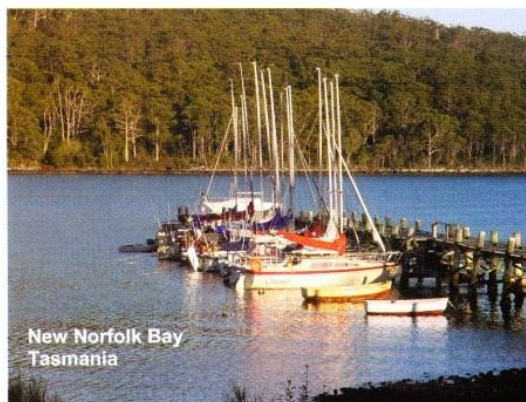
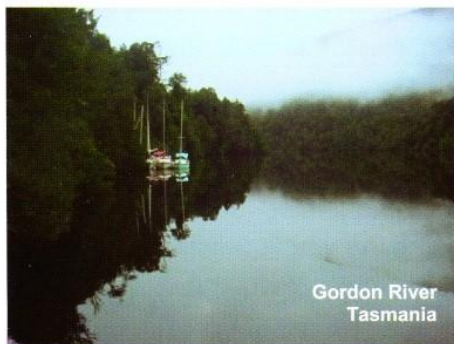

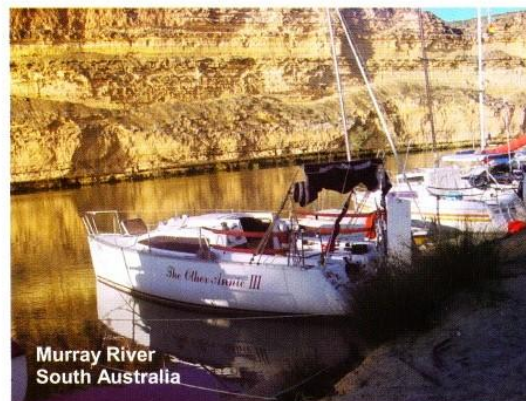

The Trailer Sailer Association of SA Inc (TSASA) began in 1967 when a group of trailer sailer owners met at Largs Bay Sailing Club to form an association. The founding officers were Peter Moore, Don Hodgson, Graham Gibbs, Tom Gluyas and Hartley Wilkinson. They owned home built and timber boats, mainly Randell 20's, Hartley TS18's and TS16's.

## WHAT WE DO

With a strength of membership and dedicated volunteer committees we have a variety of regular events to cover the many interests of our members. We have a comprehensive calendar which includes, racing, cruising, social events and educational activities.
