Kindy Program 2017:

We will have a meet & greet evening at Marco Reserve on Thursday the 6th April at 5.30pm, where teams, coaches & team coordinators will be finalised and hopefully all the uniforms and player's packs will be handed out.

Note: Program is limited to 64 players.

Cost:

\$60.00 includes shorts, socks and playing shirt.

Duration:

1st game is on 22nd April to August date dependant on the number of washout weekends we need to catch up on. (14 weeks playing)

Where:

Marco Reserve located at the cnr Marco & Homelea Ave Panania.

When:

Saturday Mornings at 9.30am (approximately 45mins to 1 Hour)

Required:

Shin Pads must be worn, boots are optional but are advised. Both are available from Rebel or Amart

Format:

- 8 Teams (Depends on total number of registered players but with max 8 players per team)
- Season Draw all teams to play each other at least twice.
- Warmup Drills (30 mins) followed by a small sided game (7 mins each way with 2 min half time break)
- Two teams each week from the draw will be trained by myself or another certified coach for the first 15mins.
- Each team will have a team coordinator and a coach or coaches (volunteers from Parents)

General Information:

- All players are required to bring the ball provided in the participants pack every Saturday for the training.
- No player is to change teams without consulting the Kindy Coordinator first.
- At the meet & greet night to be held on Thursday 6th April at 5.30pm each team will appoint a team coordinator who will be the teams and the clubs contact person. Their role will include the following:
 - Informing team of game changes and cancellations
 - Handing out of club information.
 - Informing team of club fundraising events and social outings.
 - Assist the clubs Kindy Coordinator to organise Kindy activities (eg special coaching days etc...)
- Each team will appoint a team coach to assist the Kindy Coordinator with the training on Saturday Mornings. Coaches will be required to attend a series of coaching sessions to be held on week nights before the season starts. (This role can be shared but all volunteers are to attend the coaching sessions).
- **All parents are to assist in setting up and packing away the kindy fields each game day.**
- Please support our canteen as this is our major source of revenue for equipment purchase and presentation day funding.

Game Rules

- Games are played in 7 minute halves and a 2 minute half time break.
- A maximum of 8 players from each team are allowed on the field during the game.
- Each team is to have the same number of players on the field and if necessary a player/s from the opposition will play with the team who is short to make up even teams. The team Coordinator will be given spare shirts/ bibs for this purpose.
- The ball used will be a size 3
- The size of the field will be 20m x 30m
- Each team will have a game leader and they are the only person apart from the players on the field while the game is in progress. This is a requirement of our insurance policy and is to be strictly adhered to. Only the game leader can instruct a parent to enter the field and then only when the game has been stopped.
- Parents will take it in turns to act as game leader.
- There are no goalkeepers
- There are no throw ins, goal kicks or corner kicks when the ball is out of play it is restarted simply by one players kicking the ball into the field of play under instruction of the game leader.
- Game leaders are only there to guide the players and let the game flow.
- There are no tables or scores recorded and each player is to receive the same game time.
