Basketball Explosion

There is no doubt basketball is on the rise again with the numbers of players going through the roof, and it seems like most of them want to play with us. The Basketball Club has grown by 12 teams between the last winter season and the current summer season which is an increase of over 34%. The great news is that most of that growth is in our junior program with 41 of the 47 teams we have entered at Under 18 and below. They comprise 29 boys and 12 girls' teams and are made up as follows:

The only down side is that it is becoming increasingly difficult to find coaches and training times for all the teams, and we currently have a waiting list of players wanting to join teams. A nice problem to have.

Whilst on the subject of all the new teams to the club, a huge big welcome to all the new families that have joined in the last month or so. Thank you all for your patience as we were at times a little overwhelmed with the number of players at try-outs, and wanting to join, but hopefully we are over the hump. We certainly hope all the new families and players to the club enjoy their time at the Y.

Well our new Coaching Director Kate Sherwell hasn't wasted much time getting up and running with a lot of great initiatives already happening. Firstly we had our Community Coaches Courses run by David Herbert from Geelong Basketball on behalf of Basketball Victoria where we had more than 20 of our coaches turn up over a couple of Sunday mornings for a "hands on" session of skills and drills to help them on training and game nights.
