(NP) denotes that a breach of this rule will not be grounds for protest by boat.

(DP) denotes a rule for which the penalty is at the discretion of the International Jury and may be less than disqualification.

(SP) denotes a rule for which a standard penalty may be applied by the race committee without a hearing.

1 Rules

- 1.1 The regatta will be governed by the rules as defined in The Racing Rules of Sailing (RRS)
- 1.2 RRS Appendix P, Special Procedures for Rule 42, will apply.
- 1.3 The Australian Sailing Prescriptions applies to all entries.
Appendix P will apply as changed by instruction 2.5. RRS P2.3 will not apply and RRS P2.2 is changed so that it will apply to any penalty after the first one.
- 1.4 (SP) Australian Sailing Special Regulation Part 2 Off the Beach Boats, Section 5.01 Personal Flotation Devices will apply. It is the responsibility of all competitors to ensure that the personal flotation devices comply with a standard equivalent to those listed in the regulations.
- 1.5 Kiteboard Racing Rules Appendix F.
- 1.6 The Optimist Green Fleet will be governed by the World Sailing Introductory Rules of Sailing.
- 1.7 The use of helmets for Catamarans (conform EN1385 standard) for both helm and crew is mandatory during racing.

2 (NP) (DP) Advertising and Bow Numbers

- 2.1 Boats may be required to display bow numbers and/or advertising as required by the organising authority.

3 Eligibility & Entry

Competitors and coaches shall enter the event by completing the on-line entry form on the event website www.youthchamps.org.au and paying the required fees. On-line entry opens on 6 July, 2017 and late entry fees apply after midnight 22 September, 2017. Entries may be cancelled, at the discretion of the Organising Authority, after the close of entries should a Class not meet the minimum number.

- 3.1 The regatta is open to the following classes.

- 3.2 Other classes may be included at the discretion of the Organising Authority.
- 3.3 Competitors must be under 19 years of age at 31 December 2017.
- 3.4 Competitors under 18 years of age, a parent/guardian shall sign a consent and declaration form at registration. The form will be available at the regatta office.
- 3.5 All competitors shall be members of a club affiliated with Australian Sailing or a World Sailing MYA.
- 3.6 By entering the championships competitors agree to comply with The Code of Conduct agreement contained in the online registration.

4 Entry Fees

- 4.1 Fees are stated in AUD and include any local taxes (GST).

- 4.2 If any entry is cancelled by the competitor, the entry fee will be refunded as follows:

- 5.2 No warning signal will be made after 1500hrs on the last scheduled day of racing.

6 (NP) (DP) Equipment Inspection

- 6.1 Boats may be subject to equipment inspection at any time during the event.
- 6.2 As beach trailers/dollies will be shared during the regatta, all boats shall be presented for inspection on serviceable beach dollies. 'Serviceable' specifically includes being fitted with pneumatic types at least 60mm wide (or equivalent) and have adequate padding. Any boat presented on an unsatisfactory or unserviceable beach trailer/dolly will be refused entry.

7 Sailing Instructions

- 7.1 Sailing Instructions will be available one week before the event on the website and will be posted on the Official Notice Board. Other documents governing the event may be published with the Sailing Instructions.

8 Venue

- 8.1 The regatta will be conducted at South Lake Macquarie Amateur Sailing Club, 1A Sunshine Parade, Sunshine, NSW.
- 8.2 Access to, and boat storage at the venue will be available from midday Friday 29 September until 8pm Monday 2 October 2017. Access to and boat storage at the venue outside of these times must be arranged in advance on an individual basis with the venue (see addendum B for contact details).

9 The Course

- 9.1 As described in the Sailing Instructions (SI).

10 Penalty System

- 10.1 For the Nacra 15, 49er, 49erFX, and 29er events, RRS 44.1 and RRS P2.1 are changed so that the Two-Turns Penalty is replaced by the One-Turn Penalty.

11 Jury

- 11.1 A National Jury will be constituted in accordance with “Addendum A – Australian Sailing policy on the denial of the right of appeals”. Decisions of the National jury will be final, in accordance with RRS Rule 70.5. A copy of the letter of approval issued by Australian Sailing will be posted on the Official Notice Board.

12 Scoring

- 12.1 Three races are required to be completed to constitute a series.
- 12.2 When fewer than six races have been completed, a boat’s series score will be the total of her race scores.
- 12.3 When from six to eight races have been completed, a boat’s series score will be the total of her race scores excluding her worst score.
- 12.4 When nine or more races have been completed, a boat’s series score will be the total of her race scores excluding her two worst scores.

13 Support Boats

All support boats shall be [registered](#) with the Organising Authority and will be required to comply with local legislation and event support boat regulations and the RRS. The Organising Authority may refuse registrations and accept later registration at their sole discretion. Local marine regulations specify the safety equipment to be carried and conditions under which life jackets (PFD 1) are to be worn. A copy of the regulations are available at [safety-equipment-for-powered-vessels](#) and [personal-flotation-devices](#).

- 13.1 All support boats shall keep to leeward of the start line and its extensions between the preparatory signal and the start signals and more than 50 metres clear of any competing boat or mark of the course, between the start signal and the finish of the last boat, except when asked to assist by the Race Committee.

14 Berthing

- 14.1 Boats shall be kept in their assigned places in the dinghy park or on water trotline for support boats (small boats only) as described by the Organising Authority during registration and check-in. Trailers shall not to be left within the boat park during the regatta. All trailers may be stored in the areas provided by the organising authority. Any trailers left within the boat park may be moved / relocated at the discretion of the Organising Authority.

15 Radio Communications

- 15.1 Except in an emergency, a boat shall neither make nor receive radio transmissions, text messages or cellular phone calls while racing except in an emergency or when using equipment provided by the race committee.

16 Prizes

- 16.1 Prizes will be awarded for the first three placed boats in each event.
16.2 Other prizes will be award at the discretion of the Organising Authority.

17 Disclaimer

- 17.1 Competitors participate in the regatta entirely at their own risk. See RRS 4, Decision to Race. The organizing authority will not accept any liability for material damage or personal injury or death sustained in conjunction with or prior to, during, or after the regatta.

18 Insurance

- 18.1 Each competing boat shall be insured with valid third-party liability insurance with a minimum cover of AUD \$5,000,000 (recommended \$10,000,000) per incident or the equivalent.
