

Wanneroo Basketball Association (Inc.) <u>Manager Code of Behaviour</u>

"Our aim is to ensure that all Managers behave in the "Wolfpack Way" at all times and for members from other clubs to aspire to be like us both on and off the court"

All Wanneroo Basketball Association (WBA) Managers are required to carefully read and adhere to this 'Code of Behaviour' immediately:

- ✓ Remember that you are representing the WBA when you are undertaking your role, whether at the Joondalup Basketball Stadium or at other venues, and your behavior is a reflection of your club and our organisation.
- ✓ Never ridicule or yell at a young player for making a mistake, or not winning a game.
- ✓ Operate within the rules and spirit of our sport, and that rules and Codes of Conduct are mutual agreements which no one involved should break.
- ✓ Lead by example in showing professionalism to all involved with the sport. This includes being punctual, efficient, supportive of the coach and showing appropriate behaviour towards your own team, referees and other club officials.
- ✓ Show concern and caution towards sick/injured players.
- ✓ Constantly communicate with coaches and players and their parents as to what the team is trying to achieve.
- ✓ As a Team Manager, you must set the example by being a good role model and reinforce the Player Code of Conduct. In the event you receive a Technical foul or are reported/ejected from a game, you may be called before the Representative Sub-Committee to explain your actions.

AGREEMENT...

'As a condition of entry to participate in Wanneroo Basketball Association Inc. events, programs or competitions, I agree to abide by the Managers Code of Behaviour as outlined above.

I understand that breaches of the above conditions may be referred either directly to my relevant club, to an appointed Management Committee or to a full tribunal, who at their discretion, can impose penalties up to and including the immediate removal of the manager from Wanneroo Basketball Association events, programs or competitions entirely.

For more serious breaches, the Games Manager on duty has the authority to immediately request the removal of the manager from the Wanneroo Basketball Association venue and refer the matter to the Tribunal for further action.

Additionally, I agree that as a Representative Team Manager, I must not "recruit / poach" players from other clubs within the WBA Inc. Domestic Competition to play in a Domestic club team that I am affiliated within the WBA Inc. Domestic Competition.'
