Introduction

Darling Point Sailing Squadron (DPSS) has been a part of the Wynnum-Manly sailing scene since the early 1900s. The club enjoys a convenient and spectacular location at the northern end of and near the entrance to Manly Boat Harbour.

Mission

To provide affordable, fun, friendly off-the-beach dinghy and skiff sailing on Waterloo Bay.

Vision

To be the club of choice in the south-east of Brisbane for sailors of reasonably priced dinghies and skiffs.
