From Grassroots to Gold – A Passion for Sport



Sevens star and Olympic gold medallist Ellia Green, has been honoured as Australia's third UN Women "national champion". Ellia, of Fijian origin, will become one of the official faces of the UN campaign to improve gender equality and promote female empowerment.

Vanuatu village volleyball – Mamas making history! In the Vanuatu village of Eratap, on the island of Efate, traditional culture has not encouraged women playing sport. As a result of the Volley4Change initiative, this village received equipment and support, as well as English classes. The Mamas of Eratap believe volleyball is improving their health and well-being as well as providing new opportunities for exercise, social interaction and education.

Patricia (COK) was named Flag Bearer for Gold Coast 2018. At the 2017 Pacific Mini Games she made history as – the first female Cook Islands athlete to win the a Gold medal in the Women's 200m, and a silver medal in the Women's 100m. Just prior to the Games, Patricia broke the National record with a time of 11.97secs.
