



CEO's Report

Season 2014 has been filled with many highlights across the entire Football code.

- The official opening of The Adelaide Shores Football Centre
- Celebrating the return of the derby between West Adelaide and Adelaide City at the National Premier League Season Launch in front of 3,500 spectators.
- Launching the Regional Round and subsequent partnership with the Whyalla, Mt Gambier and Roxby City Councils
- South Australia's Matthew Cream being selected as an Assistant Referee for the 2014 FIFA World Cup
- Winning the NTC Girls Challenge
- West Adelaide winning the Women's Premier Division Cup
- Having 25 young south Australians identified for National Selection
- Croydon Kings winning their first championship since 1977
- MetroStars winning the PlayStation 4 National Premier League Final
- And of course Adelaide City's giant killing performance against Western Sydney Wanderers in the Westfield FFA Cup and subsequent qualification to the Quarter Finals

On the National Stage South Australian Football is performing extremely well. We are being recognised nationally for having excellent structures in place and this is a credit to all Clubs and the FFSA Technical Department.

Financially Football Federation SA recorded a net operating surplus of \$4,113 for the financial year ending 31 October, 2014. When taking into consideration grants received for the development of the Adelaide Shores and Elite Systems Football Centres the surplus was inflated to \$1,525,457. The grant money received will be expended in order to complete mentioned projects and once completed the Net Members equity will rise to an estimated \$4.5 million. Assets will then be depreciated over the life of leases at both venues.





Finalising the Strategic Plan for the next 3 year period was an important milestone achieved in 2014 and importantly links with the new funding cycle with the Office for Recreation and Sport.

Strategically Football Federation SA will focus on 5 key areas that have been highlighted as priorities by stakeholders and include;

- o Futsal
- o Talented Player Pathway Programs
- o Referee Recruitment & Retention
- o Coach Accreditation

– Operations

- o Unification of the Football
- o Competition Management
- o Event management

– Facilities

- o Funding

- o Expansion of the Regional Round
- o Participation growth in regional South Australia
- o Regional Association Administration Support

– Stakeholder Relations and Development

The plan is ambitious and will require additional resources to achieve targets set. Football Federation SA will continue to be inclusive, accessible and multicultural.

Senior Men's Competition Report

OVERVIEW

2014 saw the continuation and expansion of the National Premier League (NPL) competition across Australia with Western Australia, Northern NSW and Victoria joining existing Member Federations, South Australia, Capital Football, NSW and Tasmania into the competitions. 2014 also heralded the introduction of another National Competition with the implementation of the Westfield FFA Cup (WFFA Cup) providing an opportunity for Member Federation clubs to compete against A-League Clubs linking grassroots clubs through to the elite clubs within Australia.

NATIONAL PREMIER LEAGUE (NPL) AND STATE LEAGUE COMPETITIONS



The twenty nine (29) Senior Men's Clubs competed across two divisions; fourteen (14) teams competing in the National Premier League (NPL), with fifteen (15) teams competing in the State League. As in previous years all teams participating in the NPL and State League were required to field a Senior, Reserve and Under 18 team in the competitions.

In the NPL 26 rounds of home and away fixtures were played and at the conclusion of the home and away season, MetroStars claimed the league premiership finishing eight (8) points clear of their nearest rival West Adelaide. As a consequence of their success, MetroStars won the right to represent South Australia in the Play-Station4 NPL Final Series.

As runaway league premiers, MetroStars headed into the South Australia NPL final series as a clear favourite. The format of the final series provided the top six teams with an opportunity to contest the finals, as outlined below.

The conclusion of the finals series culminated in Croydon Kings and title favourites MetroStars contesting the Grand Final. As with finals, favouritism counts for very little in a one off game with Croydon Kings being crowned Champions by defeating MetroStars by two (2) goals to one (1) in front 3,200 spectators at Coopers Stadium.

In the State League 15 teams contested a 30 week home and away season with the top team gaining automatic promotion into the NPL for 2015. A Play-Off series was also introduced in 2014 to determine the second promotion spot into the NPL for 2015.

At the conclusion of the home and away season, Port Adelaide was crowned champions of the State League and gained promotion into the NPL for 2015. The Play-Off series provided an opportunity for teams that finished in positions 2 - 5 to contest for the second promotional position. The format of the play-off series involved two elimination matches with the winners from each game progressing to the Play-Off Final held at Coopers Stadium as a double header with the NPL Grand Final.

The 2014 season saw a total of 1,100 fixtures played across all competitions throughout the season.

REGIONAL ROUND

FFSA expanded the Regional Round initiative launched in 2013 expanding the number of games conducted in regional areas to three matches. The games were conducted in Whyalla, Mount Gambier and Roxby Downs.

Whyalla played host to Adelaide Blue Eagles and Raiders, Mount Gambier hosted Para Hills and Cumberland United and Roxby Downs hosted WT Birkalla and Adelaide Comets with all matches played during Round 13 on Saturday 17 May 2014. In addition to the match day events, FFSA conducted a number of Game Development Clinics at schools and clubs to promote and expand football in regional South Australia.

PLAYSTATION 4 NPL NATIONAL FINALS SERIES


As South Australia's NPL League Premiers, MetroStars won the right to represent South Australia in the PlayStation 4 NPL National Finals Series. Football Federation Australia (FFA) announced PlayStation 4 as the National Premier Leagues Naming Rights Partner leading into the final series and confirmed their ongoing sponsorship of the NPL across Australia for 2015.

Going into the PlayStation4 NPL Final Series MetroStars first elimination match was against Bayswater SC (Football West) in Perth. Despite the travel and the heat, MetroStars defeated the home team on penalties. Following their success in Perth, MetroStars were drawn to play South Melbourne (FFV) in Melbourne. Although consecutive away games provided the team with challenges, MetroStars again came out on top defeating the home side two (2) goals to one (1) in trying conditions.

As a consequence of their two victories, MetroStars qualified for the PlayStation4 NPL Grand Final to be played against NSW NPL League Premiers Bonnyrigg White Eagles and if MetroStars were to be successful, they had to again win on the road. In a remarkable performance, MetroStars defeated Bonnyrigg through an early goal scored by Fabian Barbiero, which resulted in them being crowned PlayStation 4 NPL Final Series Champions.

COCA-COLA FEDERATION CUP

Coca-Cola continued its association with the Federation Cup, as the naming partner of the knockout cup competition. The competitions commenced in early February and culminated in the Grand Final at Coopers Stadium on 10 August between Adelaide City and West Adelaide. In a hotly contested final between traditional rivals, Adelaide City defeated West Adelaide by a score of four goals to one.



In addition to being crowned 2014 Coca-Cola Federation Cup Champions, Adelaide City also gained entry into the inaugural WFFA Cup and the Round of 32.

WESTFIELD FFA CUP (WFFA CUP)

As Champions of the 2014 Coca-Cola Federation Cup, Adelaide City won the right to be South Australia's representative in the WFFA Cup Competition. Adelaide City's first game epitomised the meaning of this competition, with the club being drawn against A-League heavy weights Western Sydney Wanderers to be played at Marden Sports Complex. In the biggest upset of the WFFA Cup for 2014, Adelaide City defeated the AFC Asian League Champions one goal to nil. The win catapulted Adelaide City back onto the national stage with comprehensive coverage of the match throughout local and national media outlets.

In their next game, the Round of 16 match, Adelaide City were again drawn at home against Queensland NPL Club, Brisbane Strikers. Adelaide City was once again victorious by a solitary goal. Adelaide City progressed into the quarter finals and were drawn away against Victorian NPL Club Bentleigh Greens. In a hotly contested game, which saw Adelaide City narrowly miss out on progressing to the semi-finals, Adelaide City's WFFA Cup journey ended at the hands of Bentleigh Green in extra-time.

NEW LICENCE PERIOD

In 2016 FFSA will enter into a new three year licence period for the Senior Men's Competition and the National Premier League. Throughout 2014 FFSA had been working on probable competition structures and compliance requirements for the New Licence Period, 2016 to 2018, with the aim of expanding and increasing the number of teams into the competitions. Applications for the New Licence Period opened in November 2014 with 32 teams nominating to be involved in the Senior Men's Competitions.

Due to the increase in the number of teams, the New Licence Period commencing in 2016 will see a restructure to the competitions, with a three tier league structure being implemented. As of 2016, 12 teams will compete in the PlayStation 4 National Premier League, 12 teams in the State League and 8 teams in State League 1. FFSA will be providing ongoing opportunities for teams to come into State League 1. A promotion and relegation format for 2015 will be implemented to compliment the new league structure for 2016.

Girls & Women's Competitions 2014

The 2014 Girls and Women's Season saw a steady growth in teams and participation numbers across the elite, community, collegiate and junior leagues.

Adelaide City Women's FC claimed the 2014 Women's Premier League title earning the club an incredible three titles in a row. The Women's Premier and Reserve leagues were competitive throughout the year with 9 teams competing in each league.

The Premier League competition provided a solid platform for what proved to be a competitive Westfield W-League season for the Lady Reds. The 2014/15 season saw some fantastic highlights with the Lady Reds defeating Melbourne Victory at home for the first time, Canberra United away from home, and they were the only team to defeat the 2014/15 Westfield W-League Premiers, Perth Glory.

Football Federation SA's Elite pathway programs are essential to developing more local players for the Westfield W-League and National Teams, and this year saw one of the most successful years with the NTC team winning their first NTC Challenge, and Dylan Holmes being announced Player of the Tournament.

South Australia had 12 players identified for National Team Camps during the year. Eleven of these players were involved in the Lady Reds program and five of these players; Emily Condon, Alexandra Chidiac, Dylan Holmes, Isabel Hodgson and Monique Iannella went on to be selected for the Young Matildas, and were a vital part of the squad which has qualified for the 2015 AFC Under 19 Championships.

The Community and Junior divisions have continued to grow in 2014 with solid numbers across all divisions and age groups. Participation numbers in the women's game continue to steadily increase highlighting the important role Football Federation SA and local clubs play in fostering the development of the sport for females across all ages and skill levels.

MiniRoos age groups have been a challenging area for a number of seasons and this year saw a growth in participation with an Under 9 and Under 11 League being condensed. The development of the Lady Birds Clinics played an essential role in assisting clubs with recruitment of younger players in to these age groups. Football Federation SA will continue to focus on the development of Mini Roos to encourage participation numbers at this grassroots level.

Individuals were recognised for outstanding achievements at the 2014 Celebration of Football, where all facets of the Football Family are recognised on the evening. The 2014 Women's Competition Individual Award Winners were:

Junior Premier League Junior State League

Season 2014 continued to see an increase in player participation, particularly noted at the community level of the game with three new clubs entering Football Federation SA Junior Competitions.

The Junior Premier League experienced a slight decrease of 5% in the number of teams participating in 2014. This was due to the withdrawal of a National Premier League club from the competitions. As this club was not replaced for season 2014, the team numbers were not replaced.

The Junior State League and MiniRoos programs both experienced an 8% increase in team participation from 2013 to 2014; 79 teams participated in the Junior State League, while 276 teams participated in MiniRoos Programs.

The weather continued to have an impact on competitions with a large number of matches being postponed and/or re-scheduled due to heavy rain and pitch conditions. This continues to be a challenge for clubs and administrators and the continual growth of the sport will put more pressure on the use and capacity of grounds. These challenges are being addressed by the investment in club and sport infrastructure and Football Federation SA will continue to provide clubs with the necessary support to cater for the growing number of players wanting access to the sport.

New clubs Modbury Vista and Henley Heat were welcomed into the Football Family in 2014. Modbury Vista fielded Under 12, Under 14, and Under 15 teams in the Junior State League, while Henley Heat fielded an Under 14 team in the same competition and also participated in MiniRoos programs. Adelaide University Soccer Club also entered junior football fielding an Under 14 team in the Junior State League. Football Federation SA looks forward to their continual participation and growth in 2015.

The 2014 Junior Cup Finals saw a change in venue with the event being held at Adelaide Shores Football Centre for the first time, and over 3000 people attended throughout the day. The change of venue for the Cup Finals provided a carnival atmosphere and was enjoyed by all participants. Holding the event at a Football-run facility allows revenue to remain in the sport and gave junior players the opportunity of playing at a world-class facility. Congratulations to all those who participated on the day.

Football Federation SA again hosted the South Australian Manchester United Premier Cup Qualifying Tournament held at Burton Park over the March long weekend. Hot weather forced the re-scheduling of the tournament with Semi Finals and Final matches being played mid-week. Twenty-four teams participated in the tournament. The Final was played between West Torrens Birkalla and Campbelltown City, with Campbelltown City claiming the tournament and progressing to the Pacific Finals held in Sydney.

Football Federation SA acknowledges the support provided by Mamee Foods for junior football and appreciates their contribution.

The delivery of the sport is not possible without the contribution of volunteers. The commitment and dedication of these people ensures that Football Federation SA can conduct junior competitions for all participants.

Secondary Schools Sports, SA

The 2014 School Sport Australia Football Championships, hosted by NSW Combined High Schools Sports Association, in conjunction with Department of Education and Communities, School Sport Unit and Football NSW was held from Saturday August 23 to Friday August 29, 2014 at three venues in close proximity to Valentine Sports Park (home of Football NSW). All games were played on recently laid synthetic pitches that proved to be top quality.

Extra-curricular activities were provided for players during the week. A player's BBQ held on Tuesday night was followed by a very professional and succinct guest speaker, Trevor Morgan who works for Western Sydney Wanderers National League football team, as both the Youth Team Coach and assistant Coach for the National League Team.

Trevor spoke about attitude and motivation of young recruits, as well as other 'must have requirements' to take the next step in becoming an elite footballer. His talk to the players was most direct, and he pulled no punches. His message included letting the players know that his Club would not entertain players who presented themselves at his Club with a care-free attitude, with caps around the wrong way and handling mobile phones during meetings/sessions.

Other motivational speakers featured during the week included Leena Khamis (former Matilda) and Paul Wade (former Socceroo captain). Their insight regarding professional requirements necessary to reach the pinnacle of one's chosen sport was also positive and awe inspiring.

The SA Boys finished in 5th place. Had we won our last game we could have finished in second position. It's fair to say that injuries to key players reduced our potential, particularly later in the week. It was a very tight competition throughout the week with only a solitary point separating second and fifth positions.

There were lots of positives evident throughout the week. Two of the Boys, Cohan Morris and Kegan Osborne were selected in the Australian Schoolboys Squad. Five others, Andrew Dyer, Jacob Fabbian, Jordan Elliott, Aladin Irabona and Zack Doyle were selected in the Australian Shadow Squad.

This year's Girls results were not as positive as hoped, with the squad finishing in 6th position, however the girls did play some competitive and entertaining football for periods of time but unfortunately this was unable to be translated to wins.

Encouraging signs and tight tussles were also evident during close losses to both Queensland and Victoria. It must be pointed out that the squad was relatively young and should be much better next year.

Unfortunately no girls were selected in the Australian Schoolgirls Squad but both Sarah Chappel (Underdale High School) and Zoe Haralampopoulos (Scotch College) made the Australian Schoolgirls Shadow Squad.

As expected both our Boys and Girls squads were excellent ambassadors for their state, schools, clubs and families. They had a real sense of humour and were always friendly, polite, positive, receptive and professional in all endeavours. They showed a lot of maturity and a willingness to support one another. Team spirit was evident in abundance.

My sincere thanks goes to everyone associated with the Championships, including: Secondary School Sport SA, FFSA, Lyndon Parry (Boys Coach) and Jeffrey Ellis (Boys Team Manager) for their commitment, thoroughness, professionalism, good humour and friendship, Leigh Matthews (Girls Coach), Sally Treharne (Girls Team Manager), Alice Gorman (Girls Tour Manager), all the players, all Clubs, parents, fund-raisers, sponsors, supporters etc, all players who participated in trials, Adelaide United for positive input, use of facilities and two trial games, all our hosts, including NSW Combined High Schools Sports Association, and the Championships Committee, and anyone I may have forgotten.

SA Masters Association

The 2014 season was a successful one for the South Australian Masters League as the competition expanded to include 23 teams.

Two new teams joined the competition, Phoenix and West Beach Legends, with the latter created from an existing team due to the number of players available. Regrettably one of the longer standing teams in the competition, Parafield ceased to exist.

The 23 team competition posed some logistical challenges that resulted in 10 teams being in Division One and 13 in Division Two. The full fixture list in Division Two did not allow teams from that division to take part in the cup competition. In light of this experience the league rules have been changed to avoid this situation being repeated in the future.

Barrett Reserve and Adelaide High School were again the venues for the matches. The league thanks Adelaide Shores and Adelaide High School for the support given to the league in providing quality venues. The League looks forward to continuing at these venues in 2015.

The League would like to recognise the support given by Football Federation SA, its staff and of course, the referees.

The League is in a strong financial position due in part to monies obtained through its participation in the People's Choice Lottery. The League's Executive group and team delegates continue to give the competition great support.

Overall meetings were well attended by team delegates, the important role of team delegates cannot be underestimated and given the voluntary nature of the role, delegates discharged their functions admirably. Office holders also discharged their role responsibly and with enthusiasm.

The League reviewed its Rules and made necessary changes to provide for clarity and relevance.

The League's Disciplinary Committee met on one occasion, following a serious incident during a game where a player was found to have breached the League's Fair Play Code and was banned from playing from 20 May to 21 September 2014.

On 7 October 2014 the League considered a complaint against a team which resulted in a match being forfeited by the offending team.

DIVISION ONE

The standard of this competition improves with each season. West Beach prevailed and were crowned champions with a relatively comfortable points advantage over Three Lions. White City and Whyalla were relegated.

DIVISION TWO

Yet again a new team in Phoenix won the division ahead of Spurs, it was a keen competition and final places were not decided until the final round of matches. The standard of new teams entering the competition remains highly impressive.

As it is highly likely the competition will be reconfigured into three divisions in 2015, there will be no promotion for Phoenix and Spurs.

THE CUP

Due to the congested fixture list it was not possible for Division Two teams to participate in the cup competition. The top two teams in Division One, West Beach and Three Lions played out a keenly contested final with the final score being 3-2 in favour of Three Lions.

It came to light after the match that Three Lions had played some ineligible players which constituted a breach of the competition rules, this resulted in a forfeit of the match so West Beach were awarded the cup trophy.

SUMMARY

The season was very successful on and off the field. The League remains in a strong financial position and is actively supported by team delegates.

New teams continue to show an interest in the competition. It is anticipated that the creation of a three league competition will be another move towards an over-45s competition at some time in the future.

SAJSA Report 2014

The South Australian Junior Soccer Association (SAJSA) once again held 2 excellent championships in 2014, the State Championship at West Beach in June and the Country Championship in August at Mildura.

The State event attracted 46 teams and all proved to be very competitive over the 3 days. A feature of the weekend was Yorke Peninsula, who declined to field a team for this year, elected instead to provide 2 mixed age group teams to play a friendly demonstration match. There were several players that stood out in this game which all goes well for them to field a team in 2015.

Due to the composition of the leagues, we arranged several playoff games for some of the age groups so that every team received the maximum number of games possible during the weekend. Over the 3 days a total of 133 games were played with the trophies being shared amongst all the competing Association's.

August 16th/17th saw the Country event held in Mildura with 52 nominated teams for the 2 days. Fortunately Sunraysia were able to provide 9 pitches, which with an early start allowed the 122 games over the 2 days and still have a presentation early enough for the Association's that had to travel a long way home.

Unfortunately it rained all day on the Saturday from start to finish making the conditions for players and spectators very unpleasant. Despite this the pitches held up very well and only one game had to be moved for the last time slot of the day.

Sunday turned out to be completely different with bright sunshine, allowing the pitches to dry out and the players to show off their skills to greater effect.

Once again the honours were shared amongst the Association's and the winners of the U/12 could not be decided, even after extra time, so both Broken Hill and Adelaide Hills were crowned as joint winners. In the lead up to the event we had nominations from 4 U/16 girls' teams, but unfortunately during the last 2 weeks, 3 of the nominations pulled out, leaving only the Adelaide Hills team nominated.

Rather than disappoint the team at this late stage it was decided to play them in the U/13 boys' league. Whilst not winning the division they proved more than competitive in this league without suffering any heavy losses.

Finally 2 major decisions were made at the General meeting held in Mildura to take effect for the 2015 State Championship and be put to the AGM in June for approval.

First an allowance for Association's to field up to 2 overage players in any age group, with conditions if they are having problems selecting a full squad to compete in the Championship. Secondly revert back to the original age groups for the girl's competition i.e. U/12dev-U/12-U/13 combined and U/14-U/15-U/16 combined. It was also decided to hold the Country Championship from 2016 onward over 3 days rather than the current 2 days.

All types of Coach's have been catered for; from Goalkeeping to Futsal along with Skill Training (Junior), Game Training (Youth) and Senior levels. Where possible we look to our Clubs to provide the venue, which also makes it easier for their coaches to attend.

GIRLS AND WOMEN

Ladybirds

The Ladybirds Program is for girls between the ages of 5-9. The program runs for 10 weeks and is designed to provide girls with the opportunity to explore football, make friends and have lots of fun. The Ladybirds "come and try" days provided the players with the opportunity to have a "taster" of the program before they commit. From this, it is hoped that players will develop a love for football and will go on to play for many years to come.

Lady Reds Holiday Clinic



A school holiday clinic was held at Adelaide Shores Football Centre and the Lady Reds players helped coach these sessions which boosted the overall experience for the players at the clinic. All the players received tickets into the Westfield W-League home matches and a clinic T-shirt. Skills and drills from the National Curriculum were taught and all players were enthusiastic and eager to learn each day.

Schools

Girls only soccer programs have been conducted at high schools across the state including Adelaide Secondary School of English, Mary MacKillop, Roma Mitchell Secondary College and Sacred Heart. Primary Schools were also involved including Edwardstown Primary, East Torrens Primary and Fairview Park Primary School. These programs encouraged participation, being active in learning new skills.

Clubs

This year visits were made to junior clubs, looking at development for all ages, particularly in the Under 9 and Under 12 categories. We saw the development of the first Under 9 "girls only" league which we hope will continue to grow. Club visits and Ladybird Programs were held at Bridgewater and South Adelaide Panthers. Regional association visits including, Riverland and Western Boarder (SEWFA) for development of both senior and junior girl's teams and coach education for new coaches.

MULTICULTURAL

One of the many football programs that FFSA has delivered is a community engagement after-school program at Rajah Street Reserve which has assisted over 30 disadvantaged children living in the area. The program has helped the local residents to get to know each other, sharing experiences and being active in a safe and fun environment. Nutrition tips were given to kids and their families helping them to know the benefits of healthy eating and keeping active.


Education

The Two Halves Literacy and Numeracy School Programs were originally designed to run as stand alone programs at local schools, with the purpose of educating New Arrival students about aspects of the game such as respect for laws and officials, players and coaches, provide coaching and refereeing education, knowledge of the local game, and literacy and numeracy which was themed around the game. Midway through the year a more strategic approach was taken, with schools targeted that were close to clubs. This formed a direct pathway into local community programs run in conjunction with clubs, leading to a higher level of successful integration.

Regular Soccer programs were also run at a variety of Primary and High Schools that had a high number of New arrival students, while the classes at Heathfield were for young children from the Inverbrackie Alternative Place of Detention.

Indigenous Football Program

Another program promoting the importance of diversity is the FFSA Indigenous Program with participants from the Wiltja Residence. This program gives an opportunity for Aboriginal youth to experience the joy of football and at the same time it encourages mutual respect, self-esteem and goal setting. FFSA is also forming an Indigenous Futsal team to compete in a local competition with the objective of creating a sense of belonging among the players.



Inclusive football

2014 saw the continuation of the Inclusive football program ran by newly appointed coach Igor Negroao. The program consists of weekly sessions for both junior and senior squads. This year the senior Paralympic team participated in the National Championships in Coffs Harbour, New South Wales. The team had to face hard competition but showed great teamwork defeating Western Australia and Victoria, finishing 4th overall. Female Participation Officer Tiarn Powell has been coaching the junior development squad (4-14 year old) on a weekly basis and has seen an increase in the number of players.



REGIONAL DEVELOPMENT UPDATE

FFSA hosted a meeting for affiliated Associations where Regional Development was the main topic discussed including the growth in the number of Regional Associations, growth in participation in Senior & Youth competitions in Regional South Australia, the expansion in the number of regional coaches who have Coach Accreditation Certificates and the expansion of the Regional Round.

John Mundy, Game Development Manager noted the importance of the meeting. "It is important that our Member Association's realise that it has to be a partnership to achieve positive outcomes for our game and for the representatives that gave up their time, with some of them travelling long distances, they signalled a note of intent to be part of the FFSA vision for the next couple of years".

In attendance were representatives from: South Australian Junior Soccer Association, Whyalla Junior Soccer Association, Port Pirie Junior Soccer Association, York Peninsular, Roxby Downs, Noarlunga & Districts, North West Junior Soccer Association, Western Border and Adelaide Hills Junior Soccer Association.

"Feedback from the attendees was positive, particularly on the Strategic Plan that was presented and the general consensus was that the meeting had been beneficial."

Regional Girls

The Regional Girls Program is of 12 months duration which includes coaching, coach education, referee education and the chance for regional players to participate in an international tournament (Fiji). The Regional Girls Program is aimed to identify and provide training opportunities for girls who reside in regional and geographically isolated areas. Players are identified through Country Championships and trials at satellite locations e.g. Keith/Port Pirie. The annual STIC Championships acts as a showcase for elite Junior Football in South Australia. The tournament's main purpose is as a Talent Identification Event and forms an integral part of the talent identification pathway for promising players and referees within South Australia.

FFSA offer "girls only" Grassroots Coaching Certificate for those taking part in the program as well as a "girls only" Referee Scholarship Program. The program will be conducted over a two year period, with following benefit being provided to each of the scholarship holders.

There have been many regional girls who have participated in the pathways at FFSA through the NTC and to the W-League squad. These pathways are very important for up and coming players in South Australia. Given such a high percentage of these are regional girls, this is encouraging and a positive element in continuing the development of girls football all over South Australia.

FFSA SCHOOLS PROGRAMS

Primary Schools

Ascot Park Primary School is a specialist sport and physical education school (SSP) where students are able to do 'soccer' as a subject. It is the only primary school in South Australia funded by Department of Education and Child Development (DECD) to facilitate a Specialist Sport Programme within the school curriculum. The program is established permanently into the school curriculum with a class of 19 students (both boys and girls) ranging from year 3 to 7. Students train 3 mornings a week and 1 morning a week where we look at aspects of the curriculum with a football focus. The Football Federation Australia (FFA) skills curriculum is followed and all skill levels are catered for. Students are involved in a number of extra-curricular football activities where they play against other schools, involved in futsal programmes and play for local clubs.

High Schools

As part of the high schools program, FFSA sends out coaches to aid schools which incorporate specific programs as part of their curriculum. Students are educated on a variety of components associated with the game of football including coaching and officiating as well as the physical and technical aspects of the game. Several High Schools took part in this program. Henley High school recorded their best ever year as a part of this program with two of their teams 8/9 and years 10 Boys winning their respective competitions.

Futsal

Futsal is an integral part of skills training and player development, and increases player's speed of thought and movement.

Futsal can be played by children as young as five years old and is a major factor in developing players in countries like Spain and Brazil which recommend young players to continue with futsal as long as possible.

FFSA Futsal Development Officer and ex-Adelaide United player Cristiano Dos Santos Rodrigues operates four regional academies in the north, east, south and west of Adelaide.

- North trains at Parafield Gardens Recreation Centre and has a U12 and U16 squad and is currently expanding to include U14 age groups.
- East trains at Stradbroke Primary School and has U14's and is expanding to U12s and U16s.
- West trains at Underdale HS and has U12's and U14s and is expanding to U16's. An U7 squad also trains once a week.
- South is based at Wirreanda HS and has an U12 squad and is expanding to U14's and U16's.

Development programs also occur at various primary schools including Ascot Park Primary School and Seaton Primary School.

I would like to thank all of the Game Development team, Tiarn Powell, Igor Negro, Cristiano Dos Santos, Ashleigh Young and Matthew Graser (who sadly passed away in November) for their commitment and dedication in implementing new and existing programs.

Technical Director's Report

It is said that football is the World Game.

The above is not difficult to prove, the challenge though is to define the style of football we want to play and so it can be compared with the best in the world.

We all have opinions and beliefs about football, however to achieve this we need direction and a way of getting there.

Some of the things the top countries in the world have in common are:

- World Class Teams
- World Class Players
- World Class Training
- World Class Coaches

WORLD CLASS COACH EDUCATION

For too long there was no clear direction for Football in Australia, and the result was an obvious lack of progress towards a defined objective.

This applies to both Youth Development and Coach Education, which have been identified as the two strategic spearheads to improve the game in Australia.

Coach Education is one of the biggest ways we can influence our Football landscape.

One positive aspect at the moment is the fact that we can all read from the same page and provide a consistent message through the new coach education pathway.

We have some great resource's at our disposal at the moment:

- The National Football Curriculum provides direction
- The Football Coaching Process delivers the methodology
- The National Playing Statement is the vision on the type of players we need and the football we want to play

Playing Style Statement:

- A pro-active brand of football; based on effective possession, with the cutting edge provided by creative individuals
- Defensively; the key components consisting of quick transitions and intelligent collective pressing
- The Playing Style; underpinned by a strong 'team mentality', capitalizing on Australia's traditional strengths.

All of the above has significantly impacted domestic football in Australia. The Hyundai A-League is going from strength to strength, with the quality of football on display improving every year along with the consistent increase in the number of club supporters, with new record crowds in the first rounds of the 2014/15 season.

The launch of the National Premier Leagues and Westfield FFA Cup is another positive aspect in this transformation with exciting times lying ahead for local clubs.

I believe the landscaping is slowly but surely changing, and if we continue along this trajectory of a collaborative and considered approach, football will one day become our number one sport in Australia.

COACH EDUCATION

Our responsibility is to provide local coaches with the best opportunity to learn and equip themselves with the necessary skills to progress in their personal journey.

The coaching courses in the advanced pathway are based on a clear vision and philosophy to help develop the competencies required for a coach to teach players and prepare teams to play the football stated in our 'Playing Style Statement' and to continue to improve the quality of the game in our state.

The requirement of obtaining a minimum accreditation has promoted an increase in participation rates of coaches in these courses. In addition, knowledge of the benefits and importance has become evident since the first advanced course was conducted in Adelaide.

Participation rates over the last four years:

2011 C Licence - 18 participants

2012 C Licence - 24 participants

2013 C Licence - 48 participants - B Licence - 12 participants

2014 C Licence - 50 participants - B Licence - 24 participants

It is fantastic to see many of our FFSA affiliated clubs supporting their coaches in this decision, ensuring that qualified and well prepared coaches are available to guide and teach players and teams, therefore improving the quality of football overall.

I would like to acknowledge and commend all the clubs that have done so and wish them all the best in their future.

STATE COACHING CONFERENCE

On October 5th we conducted our 3rd Coaching Conference which is a great resource offered to local coaches and another important part of the education process.

The Conference was based around the Football Conditioning Model, with international guest presenter Raymond Verheijen's, who since 1998 has been involved in every FIFA World Cup and EURO, reaching 5 semifinals and the FIFA World Cup Final with Argentina in Brazil 2014.

Feedback from previous conferences indicates that there is an enormous interest in additional information regarding the periodization model.

This year's conference presented a unique opportunity for football coaches in our state to expand their understanding whilst listening to one of the world's top football conditioning practitioners.

The Conference focussed exclusively on 'Football Periodization'. This one-day conference provided coaches holding an advanced coaching accreditation 50 points towards reaccreditation, Raymond's Book 'Periodization in Football', and the opportunity to enlarge their Football knowledge.

2014 GIRLS PROGRAMS

U13-14/15 & NTC:

The overall performances of our States squads throughout the year were admirable.

The training methods for the younger age group U13's is based on the Skill Acquisition Program (SAP) principles focusing on First Touch, Running With The Ball, Striking The Ball, 1v1.

This age group was also presented with the early stages of the Game Training Phase in which the players are introduced to basic principles on how to play as a team.

For the older age group Under 14/15 the Game Training concept was introduced and refined, providing players with a more in depth understanding on how to perform as a team.

Once again the rate of individual improvement was exceptional due to the consistent message displayed throughout the year.

STATE TALENT IDENTIFICATION ZONE PROGRAMS

We take a lot of pride in the way in which this program has developed in the last four years. The program gives us not only the panorama to make better and more accurate assessments in the identification of players, but also opportunities for coaches to be mentored and supported in their education process.

Everyone agrees that when it comes to Talent Identification there is no magical formula, there are so many aspects to consider when assessing and identifying young players.

We have adopted a holistic approach where game related exercises involving Perception, Decision and Execution are a constant part of our training methods.



One other important aspect to consider is the different stages of development which is a major factor with young players.

Our Talent Identification Zone Programs offer potential young players the opportunity to develop and learn in an environment that incorporates the above elements of player development.

Players in this program spend around 6 months going through the different stages of physiological changes and adaptation to training methods, giving them plenty of time to develop and confirm their abilities.

It is only after this lengthy process that a player is selected into any of our full-time Elite and part-time Development Programs.

Boys and Girls Pathways



2014 BOYS PROGRAMS

NTC

This year's program consisted of 3-4 training sessions a week plus a game in the National Premier League Under 18 competition. The program followed the National Curriculum with the boys being in the Game Training Phase.

The squad progressed well over the course of the year, growing in confidence and maturity, with players having to adapt to the challenges of playing against older and more physical players in 90 minute games.

The players improved technically and tactically developing a better understanding on how to work together to solve problems on match day.

As a part of the bigger picture players in this program can also experience the type of commitment and application a professional footballer requires.

The team ended the season with 15 wins 3 draws and 10 losses, finishing 5th in the league and qualifying for the finals.

U13 Skilleroos

The program consisted of 3 training sessions per week and a game in the U/14 Junior Premier League (JPL) competition.

Extra weekly games were organised against teams from the U/13 NPL age group to support the individual development of players (particularly those players who physically were not ready to play regularly against U/14's).

Every 6 weeks the players were given a minimum 7 day break to allow them to physically and mentally recover.

The training methods for the younger age group U13's is based on the SAP principles focusing on First Touch, Running With The Ball, Striking The Ball, 1v1. This age group is also presented with the early stages of Game Training Phase, in which the players are introduced to basic principles of how to play as a team.

Once again the rate of individual improvement was exceptional, this is due to having excellent foundation programs (SAP foundation squads and State Talent Identification Challenge) and the best players training full time with the best players.

Nationals

At this year's National Youth Championships the overall performance of the team and individual players exceeded our expectations. The SA squad had 9 players identified by the FFA Technical Staff as stand-out players from the tournament (same number as NSW).

U14 Skilleroos

The program consisted of 3 training sessions per week and a game which was in the U/15 JPL competition.

Extra weekly games were organised against teams from the U/14 and U/16 NPL age group to support the individual development of players (particularly those who physically were not ready to play regularly against older players).

Every 6 weeks the players were given a minimum 7 day break to allow them to physically and mentally recovery.

The training method for this age group is based on the FFA National Curriculum principles. The concept of Game Training Phase comes to be more important at this level, and learning how to play as a team is further developed.

Skill Acquisition sessions however are still part of the program, giving players an opportunity to continue to improve their core skills and technical abilities.

The quality of players at this age group continues to improve and reiterates the importance of foundation programs (SAP foundation squads and STIC).

Nationals

At this year's National Youth Championships the overall performance of the team and individual players was very positive with consistent team and player performances. The SA squad had 4 players identified by the FFA Technical Staff as standout players from the tournament.

African Nations Cup

In 2013 Football Federation SA (FFSA) in partnership with the Office for Recreation and Sport (ORS), African Communities Council (ACCSA) and City of Salisbury conducted the African Nations Cup. This annual event provides an opportunity for each African community to nominate a team in the pursuit of being crowned champions of the African Nations.

In its inaugural year of being conducted by FFSA, the participants acknowledged that the event had been conducted in a professional manner and that it provided a platform in which to increase the popularity and prestige of the event. In conducting the event in 2014, FFSA in partnership with the key stakeholders made some minor amendments to the event, designed to give more recognition to the teams and individual players.

The main change to be incorporated in 2014 was to extend the event over two weekends, ensuring that the Grand Final was played on a separate day. Previously the Grand Final had been played on the same day as the semi-finals which may have reduced the standard of play due to player fatigue. The stand alone Grand Final day also incorporated a third and fourth playoff game and a women's game. FFSA in consultation with the key stakeholders had identified the African Nations Cup as a strategic platform in which to increase girls' and women's participation in football

In addition to expanding the duration of the tournament, individual awards were also introduced to acknowledge and recognize the contribution of individual players throughout the tournament. Two individual awards were presented, the Highest Goal Scorer and Player of the Tournament.

The event was conducted on the weekend of 18-19 October 2014 at Burton Park Football Centre with the Grand Final being held on 26 October at the Adelaide Shores Football Centre. A total of twelve teams participated in the event, an increase of two teams from that of 2013. The teams were placed into three groups of four teams with a round robin format being played in each of the groups. At the conclusion of the round robin format the first placed team in each group and the second highest finishing team across all groups progressed through to the semi-finals. The winners of the semi-finals progressed into the Grand Final.

In a fairy tale final Burundi finally captured the African Nations Cup in their third consecutive Grand Final appearance. Burundi proved too strong for Sierra Leone defeating them by three goals to nil. In the third and fourth play-off South Africa capped off a successful return to the African Nations Cup, defeating defending champions South Sudan three goals to two.

FFSA is committed to working with all stakeholders to ensure that the following objectives are achieved through the annual hosting of the African Nations Cup.

1. Provide a competition that is conducted to the highest standard by providing first class facilities, quality match officials and a well organized event.
2. Build social cohesion within the African Communities.
3. Provide a career pathway in football in the areas of playing, coaching and officiating.
4. Provide a link to local clubs for players and coaches.
5. Provide an avenue for junior players and women to participate in football.

It is important for it to be acknowledged that to conduct an event of this nature requires a significant financial contribution from FFSA and ORS. In addition, FFSA allocate staff to ensure that the event is delivered to the highest standard. This tournament enables the African communities to showcase their many talented players in a professional environment that is fitting for such an event. FFSA will continue to focus on the delivery of the tournament to ensure that participants have a positive experience.



Club Conference

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 OCTOBER 2014

NOTE 1: Summary Of Significant Accounting Policies

The financial statements are special purpose financial statements prepared in order to satisfy the financial reporting requirements of the Associations Incorporation Act 1985. The Committee has determined that the Association is not a reporting entity.

The financial statements have been prepared on an accruals basis and are based on historic costs and do not take into account changing money values or, except where specifically stated, current valuation of non-current assets.

The following significant accounting policies, which are consistent with the previous period unless otherwise stated, have been adopted in the preparation of these financial statements:

(a) Income Tax

Under Section 50.5 of the Income Tax Assessment Act 1997 the income of the Association is exempt from income tax.

(b) Property, Plant & Equipment

The depreciable amount of Property, Plant and equipment is depreciated over the useful lives of the assets to the association commencing from the time the asset is held ready for use.

Leasehold Improvements are depreciated over the shorter of either the unexpired period of the lease (once the organisation takes possession) or the estimated useful lives of the improvements.

Profit and losses on disposal of property, plant & equipment are taken into account in determining the surplus for the year.

(c) Goods & Services Tax (GST)

Revenues, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of GST, except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the Australian Tax Office. In these circumstances the GST is recognised as part of the cost of acquisition of the asset or as part of an item of the expense. Receivables and payables in the assets and liabilities statement are shown as inclusive of GST.

(d) Employee Benefits

Provision is made in respect of the Association's liability for annual leave at balance date. Long service leave is accrued in respect of employees with more than five years employment with the Association.

Contributions are made by the Association to an employee superannuation fund and are charged as expenses when incurred. The Association has no legal obligation to provide benefits to employees on retirement.

(e) Inventories

Inventories are measured at the lower of cost and current replacement cost.

Inventories acquired at no cost, or for nominal consideration, are valued at the current replacement cost as at the date of acquisition.

(f) Revenue and Other Income

Revenue is measured at the fair value of the consideration received or receivable after taking into account any trade discounts and volume rebates allowed.

Interest revenue is recognised using the effective interest rate method, which for floating rate financial assets is the rate inherent in the instrument

Grant income is recognised when the entity obtains control over the funds, which is generally when the grant is acquitted.

If conditions are attached to the grant that must be satisfied before association is eligible to receive the contribution, recognition of the grant as revenue will be deferred until those conditions are met.


