The club has been settling into our new home grounds here at Ivor Marsden sports centre. It sure has been a big change with so much more room for the



players to train & play. The club house and canteen are progressing with most of the trophies and flags now on proudly display throughout the year. The Ipswich cricket clubs have been very accommodating with our move to our new home.

### **Club News**

into their game.


After a 4 week break during the school holidays and a bye the boys are itching to get back into the games and I'm sure they are ready to finish the season strongly.
