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The month of May was a busy time for Papua New Guinea Swimming.

Coach Joe Meauri was given an Olympic Solidarity Scholarship provided by Swimming Australia Limited through Oceania Swimming Association to attend the 2009 ASCTAQ Convention on the Gold Coast, Australia.

"I certainly learnt a lot during the convention and was also privileged to have personally met and listened to some of the most high profile swimming coaches from Australia, New Zealand and America," said Joe on his return.

We welcomed home our swim team from the Arafura Games held in Darwin, Australia.

The swimming competition was held over three days from Sunday 10th to Tuesday 12th May.

The swim team returned home in style with nine medals: 1 gold, 3 silver and 5 bronze plus two national records and a bag full of personal best times, along with Judith Meauri stepping up into the Gold Kundu Target Squad by swimming a qualifying time in the 100m freestyle.

It was a delight to hear from Matt Cooper (Manager) that the team bonded well and proved they were "the pride of PNG"

He also mentioned that the Swim Team had received lots of commendations for their behavior.

"The team was absolutely fantastic both in and out of the swimming pool, It was wonderful to hear so many people commenting on how well behaved our athletes were, how they carried themselves and supported and helped each other".

Well done...a credit to you all.

On Saturday May 23rd we relived the sporting moments of 2008 and acknowledged those, sportspersons for their sporting achievements. SP Brewery is the main sponsor of this event.

During the evening we witnessed swimmer Ian Nakmai being awarded the 2009 Junior Male athlete of the Year for his performances in 2008 ahead of Cricketer Raymond Haoda Jnr and Weightlifter Stephen Kari.

Ian Nakmai is a member of the elite group of swimmers in the PNG Excellence programme, the Gold Kundu Squad.

Our Olympian Ryan Pini achieved the runner-up award. PNG Paralympic silver medalist athlete Francis Kompaon was awarded the prestigious award of Sportsman of the Year.

ARAFURA GAMES FINAL SWIMS

Sunday 10th May, 2009 saw the PNG Swim Team start their competition in steaming Darwin conditions.

The program commenced at 8.00am with the morning heats. PNG swimmer 13-year old Sanford Gore hit the water in the 200m Individual Medley, setting the pace for personal best swims.

The heats saw our swimmers qualify for places in 15 of the evening finals. This brought great excitement to the team. 16 year old Peter Pokawin Jnr swam a strong 100m Freestyle final finishing in 8th place.

17-year old Judith Meauri and Carmen Kolta both enjoyed an explosive 50m Freestyle Final finishing 5th and 8th respectively, swimming personal best times in a race which had all competitors finishing within .6 hundredths of a second of one another.

In the male 17 & over 50m Freestyle lan Nakmai and Nathan Nades both swam a strong race to finish 5^{th} and 6^{th} respectively. Again in a race that had the time keepers splitting hairs.

Breaststroke specialist Ishan Guru competed in the finals of the 13-14 Breaststroke 50 metres, Ishan came in a respectable 8th place with a time of 37.47, breaking the 38.00 second mark for the first time.

Peter Pokawin, once more took to the blocks competing in the 50 metre 15-16 age group Backstroke event. In a nail biting race Peter placed 4^{th} in a photo finish between 1^{st} and 4^{th} place with a time of 31.46, again a new personal best time.

Judith Meauri competed in the 17 & over female backstroke final, where she placed 6^{th} with a time of 36.86.

The long hours and heat had now begun to take its toll on the team as they reached 10 hours on the pool deck.

To lift the spirits of the PNG side Nathan Nades gave the team something to cheer about in Male 50 Backstroke, despite his 6th placing, Nathan was up there with the leaders till the end, recording a time of 31.74 sec again beating his previous PB by .5 of a second.

Jenixon Lim followed Nades' lead and swam a strong 50m Free in the 13-14 age group to obtain a PB time of 27.20.

This was followed by Peter Pokawin and Nathan Ampa'oi, in the 15-16 100 Butterfly. Both swimmers swum a great first 50 metres however Nathan was able to power away in the last 15 metres to come in 4^{th} in a time of 1:06.10 again in a race separated by one hundredths of a second, Peter finished in 6^{th} place.

In the Female 17 and over 100 Fly event, Carmen Kolta completed a focused race, improving her heat time of 1:15.25.

Carmen's determination showed that she was ready to take on the field, with a great start, Carmen swam a very strong first 50 metres backed up with a strong finish to place 5th, again knocking a further full one second off her previous PB time set in the morning session.

Inspired by Carmen's swim Nathan Nades powered home in the Male 17 & over 100m butterfly with a time of 1:08.37, finishing also in 5th place in his division and knocking just under 2 seconds from his previous PB of 1:10.13.

The final swim of the evening was Ishan Guru in the Male 100m Breaststroke, swimming a time of 1:23.85 to finish in 6th place and recording a personal best time.

Satisfied with the outcome of the evening events the team departed for their accommodation where a hearty pasta buffet and rice had been prepared by team assistant Margaret Gore.

Monday 11th May at Casuarina Pool the PNG Swim Team received their first medals during the competition finals

The evening finals got underway with the team fired up and ready to hear their national anthem play. Gold came to young Danny Pryke and Bronze to Peter Pokawin in the male 15-16yr 50m Freestyle.

Danny swam a magnificent race to clock a time of 25.99, Peter finished a very close third behind Australian Swimmer Ryan Roelants with securing another PB time of 26.30.

Ian Nakmai picked up two medals in the finals; silver in a hotly contested 17&over 100m Male Breaststroke event, in a time of 1:10.48, a PB by over 2 sec. and a bronze in the male 17&over 50m Fly stopping the clock at 28.29.

Jenixon Lim picked up PNG's 5th medal in the Boys 13-14 100m Backstroke with a 3^{rd} place, swimming a time of 1:09.52. He also swam a creditable 5th in the 13-14 100m Freestyle and 6th in the 50m Fly with a time of 30:07.

Other results from the pool during the evening were Ian Nakmai (4^{th}) in the Male Open 200 Breastroke in a time of 2.42.36, a PB by over 4 seconds and Adam Ampa'oi (5^{th}) in a time of 2:45.70.

Young Riley Albrecht swam a strong 50m Fly in the Boys 12/U finishing in 4th place and recording a personal best time of 33.35, knocking a whole second of his previous best – set in the morning session.

Nathan Ampa'oi finished in 7th place in the Boys 15-16 50 Breast with a time of 36.15 seconds, a PB by over $\frac{1}{2}$ a second. While Nathan Nades placed 8th in the male 17 & over 50m Fly with a time of 29.84.

PNG Boys Swim Team Captain Adam Ampa'oi swam a very strong 100m Breast to place 5th overall in the 17& over age category with a time of 1:14.57.

Both 17& over PNG female swimmers Carmen Kolta (PNG Swim Team Female Captain) and Judith Meauri competed in the 100m Freestyle and the 50m Fly.

In their first 'final' swim of the evening, Judith placed 5th (1:04.07)

in the 100m Freestyle while Carmen placed 8^{th} in a time of 1:10.60. Both girls went on to compete in the 50m Fly, this time with Carmen placing 5^{th} in a time of 32.34 and Judith placing 8^{th} in a personal best time of 32.78.

Tuesday 12 May saw another great day of heat swims, placing our swimmers into the finals.

As the sun set on the Casuarina Pool the PNG Swim Team finished their Arafura Games in style collecting a further four medals, lifting their overall medal tally to nine, one gold, three silver and five bronze medals.

Jenixon Lim in the 13-14 years 50m Backstroke finished 3^{rd} in a time of 31.10 seconds.

Peter Pokawin flew home to hold out two other PNG swimmers in the 50m Butterfly. Peter swam a 28.15 to take 2^{nd} place over Danny Pryke (4^{rd}) in a time of 28.90 (0.05 seconds of 3^{rd} place) while Nathan Ampa'oi finished in 5^{th} on 29.01 seconds.

Ian Nakmai then secured his third medal of the meet in the male 17 & over 50m Breaststroke. Lining up against fellow PNG swimmer Adam Ampa'oi, Ian swam a superb race to finish 2nd, picking up his second silver medal for the meet swimming a 32.12. Adam finished a creditable 5th with a time of 33.51.

The highlight of the evening was the Men's open 400m Individual Medal, PNG qualified in the number one position in the morning but were well aware that the teams of France, Northern Territory and New Zealand were saving their best for last.

In a great swim by our boys, they picked up the bronze medal in a time of 4.22.63 against a strong field with the NT Representative team taking the gold place and France the silver.

The PNG Female 400 Medley Open relay swam into 8th sport in the final in a time of 5:31.16

Other finalist for the last session included Jenixon Lim swimming in the male 13-14 years 100 Fly coming in 4^{th} in a time of 1.07.20.

Judith Meauri swam 1:18.68 in the 100m Backstroke (17 & over) placing her 5^{th} . In the 50m Breast Judith placed 4^{th} in a time of 40.87.

Nathan Nades placed 5th in the 17 years & over 100m Backstroke in 1:08.90.

At the end of the day both the team coach Ben Wells and Manager Matt Cooper were thoroughly satisfied with the performance of all 15 swimmers who bonded well as a team and proved that they were *"the pride of PNG"*.

13th FINA WORLD CHAMPIONSHIPS PNG TEAM NAMED

At the completion of the Arafura Games, held in Darwin, Australia, six members of the Elite Gold Kundu Target Squad were named on the team to travel to Rome, Italy to compete in the 13th FINA World Swimming Championships

They are Ryan Pini, Anna-Liza Mopio-Jane, Ian Nakmai, Peter Pokawin, Danny Pryke, and Judith Meauri.

From July 17th to August 2nd 2009 the Foro Italico in Rome will be the heart of the 13th FINA World Championships for swimming, diving, synchronised swimming and water polo. The swimming events will begin on Sunday 26th July and run through to Sunday 2nd August.

These championships will see PNG field a male relay team for the first time at this level of competition. They will compete in the 4×100 m Freestyle Relay and the 4×100 m Medley Relay.

The team's training progress will be monitored by PNGSI to ensure that the best prepared team leaves our shores.

NEWS FROM THE FINA

FINA COMMISSION FOR SWIMWEAR APPROVAL

Meeting in Lausanne (SUI) on May 18, 2009

Lausanne (SUI), May 19, 2009 – The FINA Commission in charge of the swimwear approval, formed by representatives of the FINA Executive, FINA Technical Swimming Committee, FINA Coaches Commission, FINA Athletes Commission, and FINA Legal Councillor had a meeting on May 18, 2009 in Lausanne (SUI) and after reviewing **348 swimsuits** from **21 manufacturers** forwarded its proposal to the FINA Executive, who decided the following:

- 202 swimsuits approved;
- 10 swimsuits rejected for not passing the tests of buoyancy and/or thickness;
- **136** swimsuits to be modified in accordance with "Dubai Charter" rule 3.1 c), as they don't fulfil the requirement stating that "swimsuit material shall not be constructed to or include elements/systems which create air/water trapping effects during use". The manufacturers have now a deadline of maximum 30 days (until June 19, 2009) to resubmit the same swimsuit for FINA approval, with the corresponding corrections ("Dubai Charter" rule 4.3 d).

Meeting FINA/Swimming Coaches

On May 19, 2009 FINA and a group of swimming coaches coming from 18 countries met at the EPFL (Swiss Federal Institute of Technology) in Lausanne (SUI), where Prof Jan-Anders Manson, Director of the Laboratory of Polymer and Composite Technology, presented the procedures of the testing process defined on the FINA swimwear approval regulations.

The exchange of opinions was very constructive and the direction to be taken on the swimwear approval process is certainly better understood.
