



COACHES CODE OF CONDUCT

- Remember that children play for fun and enjoyment and that winning is only part of their motivation. Never ridicule children for making mistakes or losing a competition.
- 2. **Be reasonable** in your demands on young players' time, energy and enthusiasm.
- 3. Teach your players that understanding and **playing by the rules** is their own responsibility.
- 4. Avoid over-playing the talented players. All players need, and deserve, **equal** time.
- 5. Develop team **respect** for the ability of opponents as well as for the judgement of officials and opposing coaches, and their interaction with, the media, parents and spectators.
- 6. **Group players** according to age, height, skills and physical maturity, whenever possible.
- 7. Ensure that equipment and facilities **meet safety standards** and are appropriate to the age and ability of the players.
- 8. Schedule **time and length of practices** and competition that take into consideration the maturity levels of players.
- 9. Show concern and **take responsibility** for players who are sick or injured whilst under your care. Follow the advice of a physician when determining when an injured player is ready to recommence play.
- 10. As well as imparting knowledge and skills, promote desirable personal and social behaviours. Be aware of the role of the coach as an **educator**.
- 11. Seek to keep abreast of changes in sport; ensure that the information used is **up to date**, appropriate to the needs of players and takes into account the principles of growth and development of children.
- 12. Ensure that **physical contact** with a young person be appropriate to the situation and necessary for the player's skill development.
- 13. **Respect the rights, dignity and worth of every person**, regardless of their gender, ability, cultural background or religion.
- 14. Always respect the use of **facilities** and **equipment** provided.





PLAYERS CODE OF CONDUCT

- 1. Understand and play by the **rules**.
- 2. **Never argue** with an official. If you disagree, have your coach, captain or manager approach the referee during a break or after the game in an appropriate manner.
- 3. **Control your temper**. Verbal abuse of officials or other players, deliberately distracting or provoking an opponent is not acceptable or permitted in basketball.
- 4. **Work equally hard** for yourself and for your team. Your team's performance will benefit, so will you.
- 5. **Be a good sport**. Acknowledge all good plays whether they be by your team or the other team.
- 6. Treat all players as you would like to be treated. Do not interfere with, bully or take unfair advantage of another player.
- 7. **Co-operate** with your coach, officials, team-mates and opponents. Without them there would be no competition.
- 8. Play for the "fun of it" and not just to please parents and coaches.
- 9. **Respect the rights of others** and avoid use of derogatory language based on gender, race or impairment.
- 10. Be prepared to lose sometimes. Everyone wins and loses at some time. **Be a** fair winner and a good loser.
- 11. Listen to the advice of your coach and try to apply it at practice and in games.
- 12. Always respect the use of facilities and equipment provided.





PARENTS CODE OF CONDUCT

- 1. **Encourage** children to participate through their own interest and enjoyment, not yours. Support their participation and do not force them.
- 2. Encourage children to always play by the rules.
- 3. Remember children are involved in sport for their **enjoyment**, not yours.
- 4. Teach children that an **honest effort** is always as important as a victory, so that the result of each game is accepted without undue disappointment.
- 5. Focus on **developing skills** and **playing the game**. Reduce the emphasis on winning.
- 6. A child learns best by example. **Applaud good play** by all teams.
- 7. **Do not criticise your children** in front of others. Reserve constructive criticism for more private moments.
- 8. **Accept decisions** of all referees as being fair and called to the best of their ability. Do not raise issues of disagreement publicly.
- 9. **Do not criticise** opposing team members or supporters by word or gesture.
- 10. **Set a good example** by your own conduct, behaviour and appearance.
- 11. Support all efforts to remove verbal and physical abuse from sporting activities.
- 12. **Respect the rights** of others and avoid use of derogatory language based on gender, race or impairment.
- 13. **Show appreciation** for volunteer coaches, officials and administrators. Without them, your child could not participate.
- 14. Always respect the use of **facilities** and **equipment** provided.





SPECTATORS CODE OF CONDUCT

- 1. Children play sport for **fun**. They are not playing for the entertainment of spectators. They are not miniature professionals.
- 2. **Applaud good performances** from each team. Congratulate all players regardless of the outcome.
- 3. **Respect the referee's decision**. If there is a disagreement, follow the appropriate procedure in order to query the decision.
- 4. **Always be positive**. Never ridicule or shout at a child for making a mistake during competition.
- 5. **Condemn the use of violence** in any form, be it by spectators, coaches or players.
- 6. **Respect** for your team's opponents and for officials, without them, there would be no game.
- 7. **Encourage** players to obey the rules and decisions of officials.
- 8. Demonstrate **appropriate social behaviour** by not using foul language, harassing players, coaches or officials.
- 9. **Respect the rights** of others and avoid use of derogatory language based on gender, race or impairment.
- 10. Always respect the use of **facilities** and **equipment** provided.





OFFICIALS CODE OF CONDUCT

- 1. **Interpret rules and regulations fairly** and to match the skill level and the needs of the participants.
- 2. Compliment both teams on their efforts.
- 3. **Be consistent**, objective and courteous in calling all infractions.
- 4. **Condemn the deliberate foul** as being unsportsmanlike, and promote fair play and appropriate sporting behaviour.
- 5. Use **common sense** to ensure that the "spirit of the game" for children is not lost by overcalling technical violations.
- 6. Publicly **encourage rule changes** which will reinforce the principles of participation for fun and enjoyment.
- 7. Actions speak louder than words. Ensure that both on and off the field your **behaviour** is consistent with the principles of **good sportsmanship**.
- 8. Make a **personal commitment** to keep yourself informed of sound officiating principles and the principles of growth and development of children.
- 9. Help the **education process** in the game. Help players learn to play the game as well by ensuring rule infractions are understood, and **encourage fair play**.
- 10. Always present yourself in a way which encourages others to respect you and your role.
- 11. Always respect the use of **facilities** and **equipment** provided.





ADMINISTRATORS CODE OF CONDUCT

- 1. **Involve** young people in planning, leadership, evaluation and decision making related to the activity.
- 2. Give all young people **equal opportunities** to participate.
- 3. **Create pathways** for young people to participate and develop through the sport not just as a player but as a coach, referee, administrator etc.
- 4. Ensure that rules, equipment, length of games and training schedules are **modified** to suit the age, ability and maturity level of young players.
- 5. **Provide quality supervision**, **instruction** and a **safe environment** for all players.
- 6. Young people participate for their enjoyment and benefit. **Do not over emphasise awards**.
- 7. Help coaches and officials highlight appropriate behaviour and skill development, and help **improve the standards** of coaching and officiating.
- 8. Ensure that everyone involved in junior sport emphasises **fair play**, and not winning at all costs.
- 9. Give a **code of conduct** sheet to spectators, officials, parents, coaches, teachers, players and the media, and encourage them to follow it.
- 10. You set an example. Your behaviour and comments should be **positive and supportive**.
- 11. Make it clear that abusing young people in any way is unacceptable and will result in **disciplinary action**.
- 12. **Respect the rights**, dignity and worth of every young person regardless of their gender, ability, cultural background or religion.
- 13. Encourage players, coaches and officials development in your organisation and beyond.
- 14. Always respect the use of **facilities** and **equipment** provided.





MEDIA CODE OF CONDUCT

- 1. Provide coverage of children's **competitive and non-competitive sport** as well as reporting adult sport.
- 2. Be aware of the **differences** between adult sports programs and children's sports programs.
- 3. Place in proper **perspective** the isolated incidents of unsporting behaviour rather than make such incidents the "highlight" of the event.
- 4. Focus upon children's fair play and their honest effort.
- 5. **Do not place unfair expectations** upon children. They are not miniature professionals.
- 6. **Identify and report** on the problems of children participating in organised sport and report the violations and distortions of their rights as participants.
- 7. Be aware of the **difference** between the goals of **amateur sport** and those of **professional sport**. Make the readers, viewers and listeners aware of these differences. The professional is an entertainer and wage earner and this, on occasions may be reflected in the professional athlete's behaviour.
- 8. Avoid use of derogatory language based on gender for any reason.
- 9. Always respect the use of **facilities** and **equipment** provided.





TEACHERS CODE OF CONDUCT

- 1. **Encourage** young people to develop basic skills in a variety of sports and discourage overspecialisation in on event, sport or playing position.
- 2. **Create opportunities** to teach appropriate sports behaviours as well as basic skills.
- 3. **Give priority** to free play activities, skill learning and modified sports over highly structured competition for primary school children.
- 4. **Prepare** young people for intra and inter school competition by teaching them correct basic sporting skills.
- 5. Make young people aware of the **positive benefits** of participation in sporting activities.
- 6. **Keep up to date** with coaching practices and the principles of physical growth and development. Read and use the latest coaching and teaching resources for junior sport.
- 7. Help young people understand that **playing by the rules** is a responsibility.
- 8. Give all young people **equal opportunities** to participate in administration, coaching and refereeing as well as playing.
- 9. **Respect the rights**, dignity and worth of every young person regardless of their gender, ability, cultural background or religion.
- 10. Always respect the use of **facilities** and **equipment** provided.
