2010 Rottnest Channel Swim



MMLSC was recently represented for the first time in the Rottnest Channel Swim in W.A. With over 900 boats and 2000 swimmers the Rottnest Challenge is the worlds largest open water swim and attracts entrants from across Australia and overseas. Pitting swimmers against the elements over a 19.73klm stretch of open water where strong currents, swell and wind are the norm proved irristable to Mt Martha Icebergers Brad Johannsen. Jim Alsop,

Bleasby and Gary March. Supported by paddlers and fellow club members Andy Whitehouse and Grant Gibbs the team of 4 swimmers left Cottosloe Beach at 6.45am with Jim Alsop punching out the first 1klm leg. The remaining 18.73klm's involved swimmer changeovers every 5 – 10 minutes as the guys battled

sloppy seas, a floatilla of support craft and fellow swimmers. In the end the team completed the journey in a very respectacle 7.41mins and in 261st place overall. With the hard work done the guys then retraeted to the chartered 60ft mother ship, Australia Blue to enjoy a refuelling BBQ. The team is already plotting another tilt in 2011 and would love more club members to fly the flag so keep late Feb 2011 free and start training. Well done team. **Grant Gibbs**
