## **Downtown Dingo's History**

The Toronto Downtown Dingo's were formed in February 1996. The original idea of forming the eighth team in the Canadian Australian Football Association came from a traveling Australian and accomplished footballer, Mark Jones.

Mark enlisted the starting core of players from rival clubs, Chris Cunning, Tino Riccio, Tim Moller and Paul Tinkler from the Broadview Hawks with Terrance Wallis, Chris Cateno and Arco Van den Huevel from the Mississauga Mustangs.

Numerous meetings followed and Terrence Wallis (CAFA founder) was elected the first coach of the Dingo's. The club quickly adopted the Essendon colours of Red and Black, as it was agreed that dark colours showed strength and aggression, which has been a trademark of the Dingo's. The nickname of the Dingo's was decided by voting on numerous animals (Canadian and Australian) and so the popular catch phrase "Downtown Dingo's" was born.

The club quickly sprang into action enlisting new players through intensive recruiting drives. A training facility was found, a long way from downtown Toronto at a school near Bloor/Islington.

1996 was an exciting season for CAFA with eight competitive teams fighting out the battle for four positions, the Downtown Dingo's did not disgrace themselves in their first season, finishing 5<sup>th</sup> only missing the finals by percentage in what was a great year.

The club is extremely proud of its success both on and off the field. In 1997 the club worked hard to locate a training venue and sponsor in the downtown area. The club has trained at Yonge and St Clair since 1997 and has only missed the finals twice since its inaugural year 1996.

In five short seasons the club has enjoyed numerous characters from Australia, Canada and many parts of the world as players and supporters. The contribution of all these people is at the true heart of the club as the club grows in strength and numbers each year.

Year 2000 was a very special season for the Toronto Downtown Dingo's winning its first premiership and forming the club song, a first for CAFA teams.

In 2001 the club was in search of back to back success, losing key members of the Premiership side of 2000 the club re grouped and recruited strongly, however after a strong but spasmodic season the team was unable to succeed in the final series loosing 2 close games to miss the grand final and the chance to defend the premiership

2002 saw the Dingo's return to the Grand Final for the second time in their history. Unfortunately the success of 2000 could not be repeated, however there was success in many ways. It has been a season where we have seen the changing of the guard, with many new exciting players aboard the club can be excited with what lays ahead.

2003 with a new coach, new executive and many new faces the Dingo accomplished the unthinkable, going undefeated to become premiers and champions for the first time in club history.

### Season Record

The Dingos season could not have been more perfect completing the most successful season in their short history to be crowned Premiers and champion in 2003. The team recorded 15 wins during the regular season, and won the first preliminary final against 2<sup>nd</sup> place Rebels by 80 points to advance to the Grand Final. The first year Etobicoke Kangaroos in a shock upset defeated the rebel by a point to advance to the Grand final, however the Dingos were too good winning by 40points to run out premiers for the 2<sup>nd</sup> time in their 8 year history.

### Highlights

The season itself was highlight for the Dingos in 2003. The club recording its first perfect season and importantly going one step further than last year to win the premiership. New coach, Peter Gordon took on the role of coach and prepared the team to face all, focusing on fitness, skills and team work. The commitment of players throughout the season to respect there team mates, and to be accountable to themselves and the overall team was a large reason for the



success of the club in 2003. The old saying that a champion team will always beat a team of champions was true of the 2003 Dingos. As each player knew his role on the team and had the belief of his team mates to succeed.

## **Individual Accomplishments**

The Dingos are seen as a team first and foremost, but individual accomplishments deserve recognition.

- The OAFL announced its first all star team based on the player content rules. The Dingos had 5 representatives – Peter Gordon (coach) Bryon Wells (DVC) Danny McIlravey, Craig Stewart and Michael Radywonik – a great achievement.
- The Dingos featured predominantly in the Canadian National team and The Australian all star team that took on the USA in Pittsburg. Representing Canada was Danny McIlravey, Chris Buzchowski, Mike Butcher and Bryon Wells which lost narrowly in a tight contest. For the Australians the club was represented by Craig Stewart, Paul Tinkler, Dave Sutherland, Michael Radywonik and Chris Jordan, they recorded a resounding victory against a talented USA team.
- Jamie Prescott became only the 3<sup>rd</sup> Canadian player to play 50 games for the Dingos and we look forward to him playing many more.
- Paul Tinkler played his 100<sup>th</sup> game of OAFL football,
- Peter Gordon became the first and only coach Dingos coach to complete a perfect undefeated season
- Jacob Steinberg kicked his first goals for the club finishing with 2

## **Finances**

The club goal at the beginning of each season is to have sufficient funds in the team account to cover our league fees for the upcoming season. We have been able to meet this goal. The Dingos are in a very stable financial position, and this has been realized through:

- Collecting team fees from each registered member of the club, and having no member with outstanding fees due.
- Revenue collected through our sponsor, the Sports Centre Café.
- Revenue generated from our annual Grand Final Party held at the Sports Centre Café.
- Revenue generated from beer sales, and the excellent work of Jacob Steinberg

## **Sponsorship**

Prior to the start of the season we approached the Sports Centre Café in an effort to gain sponsorship funds. We requested and received a cash sponsorship. A successful sponsorship relationship was achieved because of solid commitment from both the club and the Sports Café. Our 2 main requests of the sponsor were:

## **Recruitment**

The Dingos were able to successfully field a full team for each game during the 2003 season. The strength of our numbers were highlighted by the commitment and numbers at training throughout the year

This season not only did we see the return of many first year and established players, but also the inclusion of 11 new players.

Successful recruitment of Canadians to the game came largely through word of mouth and existing team members bringing new players to the game. Our web site continues to be an effective recruitment tool for our club and the club can look forward to continuing success in the season come.

The Toronto Downtown Dingo's kicked off the 2003 season, against the Toronto Eagles, eager to avenge and erase the disappointing loss of Last years Grand Final.

The game dedicated in honor of past player Mike Lazecki, who was tragically killed earlier in the year was highly anticipated, and included many new faces for both teams. The new look Dingo's team, lead by premiership player Peter "Brolsey" Gordon, was ready to face all challenges out ran and out coached the Eagles, to a convincing 17 point victory.

Much off-season preparation has resulted in the recruitment of many new players, and the club welcomed the following guys for their first games as Dingos: Tim Pendlebury, John "Stynesy" Enright, Mark McDonald, Joe Gesualdi, Dan Prior, Orenzo "Ozzie" Zivolak and Christian Knapp. We look forward to these guys becoming an integral part of the club as we chase our 2nd Premiership in 2003.

The Dingo's won the toss under new captain Craig Stewart and kicked with the breeze to the aid of a 3-5 goal advantage. The Eagles were first to open their account, taking advantage of their 6'7" ruckman to post the opening goal. Much credit to the Dingo's on ballers and back line as they did not panic and responded well with onballer Bryan Wells reading the play beautifully in the centre bounces to constantly drive the Dingo's into attack. The turning point was when the Dingo's took full advantage of the wind and moved the ball with authority from the full back line for a goal by switching play, through creative centre man Craig Stewart, the dingo's lifted as a team, and their heads with confidence to control the rest of the game.

The first quarter success belonged to the efforts of the Dingo's on ball players. Brad Herd playing his first game in the ruck, was tremendous, giving away many inches in height, fought hard and had the better of his opponent around the ground. Danny McIlvray and Bryan Wells were fantastic





and by the end of the game were suffering leather poisoning as result of their hard work and never say die attitude. Craig "5 behind" Stewart was elusive all day, and had many possessions - if not for inaccurate kicking may have kicked a 7 or 8 goals. Most importantly was their consistency over the 4 quarters that ensured the Dingo's first use of the ball on many occasions.

Up forward the Dingo's played a new look forward line with big Butch Buczkowski at full forward marking strongly and kicking 3 impressive goals. Centre Half Forward - Josh Sharp relished in his role up forward and was an excellent target who took advantage of his opportunities despite giving away much advantage in height. Stuart Wallis was a dangerous option upforward, kicking a vital goal in the third term to cement the team's lead. The entire forward line worked together well, doing the little things to create team opportunities and put the score on the board.

The back line, lead by full back Bob Clarke, who played a superb full backs' game by attacking the ball and running in straight lines to repel many Eagle attacks. He was well supported by first gamers Dan Prior and John "Stynesy" Enright to send the Dingo's into attack through creative handball and quick play on options. Chris Ritchie back from an injury prone season, played one of his best games as a Dingo as he made the Dingo's halfback line his own, combining with roommate Bryan Wells and Danny McIlvray, the threesome combined in many Dingo's forward attacks. Chris played a text book back man's game, being tight on his man, and attacking to create options up forward. Also settling in well on the half back line was skillful utility Mark McDonald, who delivered the ball with precision into the forward line. Centre half back Paul Tinkler, played a strong defensive game, punching the ball away and making his man work hard for limited possessions. Established Canadian players Jamie Prescott and Rick Krompamp, played solid games and never let their opponents get the better of them.

Rick playing in an unaccustomed role in the back pocket, took his assignment to task, first stopping and then comprehensively shutting down the Eagles grand final goal kicking hero in a disciplined effort whereby he did the little things for the team to ensure a Dingo's victory.

Tim Pendlebury and Brolsey Gordon, played impact roles, coming on to the ground to be exciting forward options, their experience and straight line approach to the ball, lifted and steadied the Dingo's at vital times in the game and their effort cannot be overstated. The win was a 100% team effort with all players and support staff contributing on the day, excitingly much improvement can come and through a committed effort and hard work on the training track there is no reason why the Dingo's can't be their when it matters most. ## **Dingo's Win OAFL Grand final**
