Dear Tournament Teams,

We look forward to welcoming you to our 2022 Tournament. Below is some information that will assist in ensuring everyone knows what the expectations are during this event.

- Teams should arrive no more than 10 minutes before their scheduled start time, enter the stadium approximately 5 minutes before game time and be ready to start on time.
- We ask where possible to consider limiting the number of spectators that attend your child's game – this will help numbers inside the stadium
- Games at both WS&LC and LJS will have staggered start times to assist with crowd management and will consist of 20-minute halves, 2 minute warm up and 2 minutes half time interval. The clock will stop in the last minute of each half – all whistles
- All teams will play a minimum 4 games across the weekend
- Once your game has concluded you will be expected to leave the venue. Venues will operate on the principal of 'get in, get out'.
- Please follow directions of volunteers at the venues
- Face masks are required in venues for all patrons aged 8 years and older
- Players and Coaches should ensure that they are registered via PlayHQ. Players not registered will be unable to take the Court.
- Please ensure that you hand sanitise upon entry and exit. Hand Sanitisers will be readily available at each venue
- Each team should supply their own warm up balls
- All attendees should maintain social distancing of 1.5 metres
- If you are unwell, please do not come to our tournament
- There will be limited refreshments at each venue

Venue Vaccination and QR Check in Requirements

Wodonga Middle Years Campus (Huron)

Persons 18 years and under are not required to show proof of vaccination to organisers when participating in community sport on school premises. Please ensure that you check in using the venue QR Code.

Wodonga Sports & Leisure Centre

It is a condition of entry to the Wodonga Sport and Leisure Centre that persons aged 18 years and older show proof of vaccination to organisers. Please ensure that you check in using the venue QR Code.



Lauren Jackson Stadium

There is no requirement to show proof of vaccination status to organisers. It is recommended that you check in using the venue QR Code.

Scots College – Updated 1-2-2022

It is a condition of entry to the Scots College that persons aged 16 years and older show proof of vaccination to organisers. Please ensure that you check in using the venue QR Code.

Given that Covid-19 Restrictions are dynamic, Wodonga Basketball continues to monitor restrictions as imposed by the Victorian and NSW Governments and these will be communicated via our Facebook and Tournament Pages.

Covid-19 Case during the tournament, what is the process? (Basketball Victoria recommended process)

- The individual notifies the association.
- The association notifies the team / club involved about the positive result – recommends they get tested.
- The association (or club if applicable) should notify the opposition team and referees. This group are known as 'social' contacts.
- Any social contact experiencing symptoms should use a Rapid Antigen Test. Understandably these are difficult to obtain at the moment.
- If the test is negative, there is no need to isolate, but they should monitor for symptoms and use a Rapid Antigen Test daily for 5 days.
- If someone tests positive on a Rapid Antigen Test, they must report the result at coronavirus.vic.gov.au/report
